### **Minutes and Action Plan from previous meeting**

**Digital Skills Programme for people aged 65+ -** Andrea Miller, lead on the digital skills programme for Shropshire Council

Andrea took the board through a brief run through of the programme. (Report attached)

- Pilot run from 2020 through the pandemic
- Programme has grown now have over 19 learning locations.
- The Council has now awarded another three years of funding at £90,000 a year to support 2250 older people to improve their digital skills and to help make their lives simpler, easier, better connected and happier.
- Regular working groups with a group of 20 digital learners and the web development team looking at aspects of the Council website, helping to make our website better work better for them. First looking at the Council Tax pages

Andrea commented: All of our learning providers are really open and good about sharing, sharing learning and supporting new volunteers coming through. And I just wanted to add that the age range for the one-to-one support is over 65, but with the new programme I have managed to have the digital drop-in age group lowered to over 50s. So we've got one to one support which is the primary focus of the programme.

### **ADDED 21<sup>ST</sup> MARCH 2023:**

To better meet the needs of our digitally isolated citizens, access to the Digital Skills Programme 2023 to 2026 has broadened.

Participants in all aspects of the programme must now meet one or more of the following criteria:

- Be aged 65 and over.
- Live alone
- Provide unpaid care for a friend or family member or receive formal or informal care.
- Have a disability or health condition.
- Be in receipt of Pension Credit or other means-tested benefit.

This is great news and means that 2250 of our area's most isolated and harder-to-reach individuals can access free digital help and support.

## Questions & Answers

**Q.** Are there any plans by the Council or any options to offer the same sort of support to different groups such as carers or individuals with learning disability perhaps?

**A.** I'm in the process of commissioning, so we've got existing providers that are going to be having new commissions, but we've also got some publicity going out to encourage organizations to come forward so that they can benefit from delivering the digital skills programme. And I'm really, really keen to work with specialist organizations and support them to deliver digital skills for other groups.

I've got a remit that it's got to be over 65s, but I'm keeping an open mind because I'd really like to have specialist programmes for people with learning disabilities, for people with sight loss, because you can't get this help in one of our digital learning centres from a volunteer. We can only expect so much from volunteers. But that kind of specialist support needs to come from specialists. So I'm already in conversation with Sight Loss Shropshire. And I think in those circumstances, we should be looking at different age groups.

**Q.** What's the average age of the people who are attending the skills programme, do you get really elderly people in their 80s and 90s attending?

**A.** 59% of participants are over the age of 75. We've do have one participant who's 96 and that's the oldest participant we've got taking part at the moment. The majority are in the 75 to 84 age category, so we are working primarily with our older residents.

**Q.** Is the three years' funding absolutely guaranteed?

**A.** Yes. I've put the project information document in for three years and I've been told it's for three years, but the grants will be awarded annually in those three years. So, no provider will get three years of funding, they'll get annual funding to deliver, set to set outcomes.

**Q.** Is there any way of pulling in more funding with other organisations applying for grants to do this?

**A.** That has happened several times in the last 15 months that I've definitely been supporting our community groups to apply for more funding. We haven't had any success yet. So, the last bid that we put together, obviously this is me supporting them with the evidence and showing them the Power BI reports and all the data that they needed.

Mayfair, Roy Fletcher and Age UK put together a bid to Santander to set up more digital learning hubs and that failed. But when I met with Age UK, she said that the same team are getting together to put in some Big Lottery funding because they want to deliver more over a larger area. Bearing in mind they want to include Telford and Wrekin as well.

And to also set up a digital network of community providers, to convene and share best practice and so on. I encourage sharing of best practice. And when new providers come in, I get them to visit existing learning centres so that they can learn how to do it well and also new digital volunteers can be trained up in other learning centres on how to deliver the programme.

## Not Another Coproduction Project

Sophie Davies updated the Board on the 'Not Another Co-production Project' being held in the West Midlands by the Ideas Alliance.

- 12 organisation have been chosen to be part of the project.
- Number of workshops have been set up.

- Online training for the organisation
- The project is just for organisations-only to help organisations start to work co-productively with local residents, giving them the tools and knowledge and advise on what to do and how to evidence.
- Festival at the end to showcase to each other what the participants have learnt and what has work well/not worked well in their organisations.

### **Update on Experts by Experience Involvement Policy**

Experts by Experience meeting arranged for Friday 17<sup>th</sup> March to look at developing an Experts by Experience involvement Policy that will be used by the council and the ICS (NHS). The meeting will be a space for the Experts to speak freely about their experience, good or bad and make suggestion on what should be included in the policy.

### **Feedback from working groups**

#### **Information Review**

- Review finished of information sent out via Let's Talk Local
- Hospital Discharge changes proposed.
- First Point of Contact changes proposed.
- Meetings to be arranged with each team to discuss changes the MiR group have made.
- Propose monitoring response from residents receiving the new literature.
- Pull together feedback from teams and promote the Information review the group are offering.
- Look at having a central point to house all new letters and archive old – SharePoint could potentially do this.
- All letters will have the 'last updated' date on the bottom right-hand corner.

#### **CQC READINESS**

CQC readiness meeting, peer review arranged for the 30<sup>th</sup> of March. A number of board members will be attending to represent people with lived experience. The focus of this session will be Co-production in Shropshire. Focusing on these questions.

- What works well?
- What are our challenges?
- What are we doing to address them?

#### **Communication meeting feedback**

An initial meeting has taken place with the Communications team manager, Laura Pell, to discuss the language and style of documents and reports that go out to the public.

Suggestions put to Laura were:

- Style guides to help staff write appropriately for their audiences.
- Glossary of alternative words to use to cut out the 'council' jargon.

#### **Local Account**

Sophie Davies asked the board to help with producing the Local Account

- Ideas on a new layout
- Provide content and stories form the community.

**Co-Production Champions**

Sophie Davies explained to the board the idea of having Co-production Champions within each team in the council, trialling initially in Adult Social Care. A 1-page outline proposal has been written by Sophie and Jane and sent to Laura for consideration. Should the idea be successful, Sophie has asked the board to co-produce the idea and move it forward.

**Web pages**

Sophie Davies took the Board through the draft version of the Making it Real web pages. They will be going live week commencing 27<sup>th</sup> March, Sophie will organise communications and adverts to be put out via the council to advertise the new web pages.

**Any other business**

Stewart Smith invited interested parties to come along a Workshop on day opportunities, taking place on the 28<sup>th</sup> April, led by NDTI (National Development Team for Inclusion). Slides attached.
