## THE SHROPSHIRE COUNCIL (PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING AND PARKING PLACES) (CONSOLIDATION) ORDER 2009 (MILL STREET AND TELFORD ROAD, BRIDGNORTH) (AMENDMENT) ORDER 2025

On 29 May 2025 Shropshire Council made an order to make the following changes to parking restrictions on Mill Street and Telford Road in Bridgnorth:

No Waiting at any time.

Mill Street From a point 76 metres north of its (B4363) junction with Bridge Street to its (West side) junction with A442 Mill Street.

Mill Street From its junction with the B4363 Mill Street to its junction with the A442

(West side) Telford Road.

Mill Street From a point 28 metres north of its (B4363) junction with St Johns Street to its (East side) junction with A442 Mill Street.

Mill Street From its junction with the B4363 Mill (A442) Street to its junction with the A442

(East side) Telford Road.

A442 Telford Road From its junction with A442 Mill (West side) Street to a point 3 m north of the

southern property boundary of 31

Telford Road WV15 5NG

A442 Telford Road From its junction with A442 Mill (East Side) Street to a point 3 m north of the

southern property boundary of 31

Telford Road WV15 5NG

Disabled Badge Holders only. 40 mins no return within 1 hour.

Mill Street From a point 4 metres north of its (East side) junction with St Johns Road for a

distance of 6.6 metres in a northerly

direction.

Limited waiting.

8am to 6pm 40 mins no return within 1 hour.

Mill Street From a point 10.6 metres north of its

(East side) junction with St Johns Street for a

distance of 17.4 metres

Any existing restrictions at the above locations will be revoked.

These changes will come into effect on 31 May 2025.

A copy of the order may be examined during normal office hours (8:45am-5:00pm Monday to Thursday, and 8:45am-4:00pm on Fridays) at Shropshire Council, The Guildhall, Frankwell, Shrewsbury.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order, or any provisions in it, on the grounds that they are not within the powers conferred by The Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within six weeks from 29 May 2025, apply for that purpose to the High Court.
