Well done to everyone. We are so proud of you!










Welcome to 2 new members of staff at our school!

SVS Children in Care School Council – we are in the process of setting this up - if you know of any young people (year3 up) who may be interested in joining, please forward their names.



Our Shropshire PEP - Top Tips

- Pre-populate the 'My Personal Education Plan'. This really helps to guide the conversation in the meeting.
- Make use of the tab 'Key stage results' to see EYFS, KS1 and 2 results already put on there for you.
- Got a photo of your young person engaging in an activity? Share it at the PEP and add it to the documents at the bottom of the child's front page as a memory they can keep.







Reminders on Attendance

Many thanks for your diligence in ensuring attendance data for Looked-After Children is updated weekly in the EPEP Attendance Module.

It is crucial this is up to date every week in line with expectations from the new Attendance Guidance

You can pass this task on to an **Attendance Officer or administrator** in your school – just email the person's name and email address to anne.c.williams@shropshire.gov.uk.

The weekly update otherwise is assigned to you as DT. Please let us know if there are personnel changes in your school so we can ensure the right person is receiving the requests from ePEP every Monday. The Attendance Module is separate from the PEP so there is no access to all the information contained within a PEP and attached documents by those completing the attendance input.

Suspensions

Through working closely together we aim to avoid as many suspensions as possible, but if they do happen please ensure that children's Social Workers and Virtual School are made aware on the same day with a copy of the exclusion letter. These can also be attached to documents on the pupil's profile page in ePEP.

Previously Looked After Children



Children who have been Previously Looked-After are highly likely to have barriers to or gaps in their learning as a result of their experiences and allocation of PP+ recognises their need for support.

It is for School Leaders to decide how to spend the PP+ Grant within the requirements of the Conditions of Grant and the Guidance recommends that the Designated Teacher consults with their Virtual School on how to spend it effectively, where appropriate.

- Your commitment is stated in an agreement for clarity and effective use of our children's PP+

Time for You is for school staff who would like a reflective space to have a conversation about supporting a young person with their education. This is available for your school re:

- young people in care to Shropshire
- or were Previously Looked After
- and this will now be open to schools who wish to discuss Children with a Social Worker.

It is objective, safe and a supportive space which enables you to discuss your authentic feelings, thoughts and concerns around supporting this young person and gives time to considering possible ways of moving forward with them.
