# The Index of Multiple Deprivation 2010 in Shropshire County

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# **Executive Summary**

The Index of Multiple Deprivation 2010 (IMD 2010) is a nationally recognised measure of deprivation at the small area (Super Output Area – SOA) level. It measures deprivation in its broadest sense by assessing indicators relating to income, employment, health and disability, education, skills and training, barriers to housing and services, crime and the living environment. It is an important tool for identifying the most disadvantaged areas in England and can be used locally to help prioritise services and resources to help tackle health inequalities and social exclusion.

# Shropshire Results for 2010

- In terms of overall deprivation, 2.8% of Shropshire's population lived within the most deprived areas in England. This increased from 1.6% in 2004 and 2.1% in 2007. Only 5 SOAs fell within the most deprived fifth nationally, these were located in Harlescott, Meole Brace, Monkmoor, Battlefield and Heathgates and Market Drayton East.
- 14.6% of the county's population lived in areas which fell within the least deprived fifth of areas in England. This was slightly down from 15.1% in 2004 but up from 12.7% in 2007.
- 4.6% of Shropshire's population, 4.4% of children and 4.4% of older people lived within the most deprived fifth in terms of income deprived in the country.
- 6.6% of Shropshire's population were living in areas which fell into the most deprived fifth nationally in terms of employment. There has been a steady increase since 2004, from 2.5% to 4.8% in 2007 and 6.6% in 2010.
- Nearly eight percent (7.7%) of Shropshire's population lived in areas within the most deprived fifth nationally in terms of Health Deprivation and Disability; this increased dramatically from 2.1% in 2007.
- In 2010, 11.4% of Shropshire's population lived within the most deprived fifth of areas in England in terms of education, skills and training overall. This figure was 7.7% in 2004 and 6.6% in 2007. For education, skills and training affecting children and young people, in 2010, 8.4% of Shropshire's population lived in areas which fall in the most deprived fifth. This increased from 3.3% in 2004 and 4.2% in 2007. For education, skills and training affecting adults, in 2010, 13.5% of the county's population lived in the most deprived fifth of areas nationally. This has remained unchanged since 2004.
- In terms of Barriers to Housing and Services overall, in 2010, over one third (34.4%) of Shropshire's population lived within the most deprive fifth of areas in England. In 2004, this proportion was 33% and in 2007 it was 39.3%. Between 2004 and 2010, Shropshire became more deprived in terms of wider barriers to housing and services. The proportion of the county's population living in the most deprived quintile increased from 0% in 2004 to 3% in 2010. In 2010, 43.8% of the county's population lived in areas which were among the most deprived

fifth nationally in terms of geographical barriers to housing and services. This dropped slightly from 2004, when it was 48.7%.

# Introduction to the Indices of Deprivation 2010

The Index of Multiple Deprivation 2010 (IMD 2010) is a nationally recognised measure of deprivation at the small area level. It is an important tool for identifying the most disadvantaged areas in England and can be used locally to help prioritise services and resources to help tackle health inequalities and social exclusion.

The Department for Communities and Local Government commissioned the Social Disadvantage Research Centre (SDRC) at the Department of Social Policy and Social Work at the University of Oxford to update the IMD from 2007. After public consultation, the IMD 2010 has been produced using the same methodology, and same structure including domains and indicators as the IMD 2004 and 2007 but with more up-to-date data (for more detail see document entitled "The English Indices of Deprivation 2010" produced by the Department for Communities and Local Government March 2011 and available from www.communities.gov.uk ). By retaining the same structure and methodology, the Index can be used as a consistent measure to accurately track change over time.

#### How the Index is Calculated

The model of multiple deprivation used for the IMD 2010 is the same as that used in past IMDs dating back to 2000 (IMD 2007, IMD 2004, and IMD 2000) (The English Indices of Deprivation 2010", Department for Communities and Local Government, March 2011, available from www.communities.gov.uk). The model allows for distinct domains of deprivation to be measured separately for the same geographical area. Each of these domains has an additive effect on the overall measure of multiple deprivation.

The IMD 2010 uses a total of 38 Different indicators within 7 domains. The scores for each domain are weighted as follows and when combined create the overall IMD 2010 score:

Domains of Deprivation	Examples of measures	Weighting

Health Deprivation and Disability	Mortality rates, Hospital admissions	13.5%

Barriers to Housing and Services	Housing overcrowding, Access to owner- occupation, Access to services (e.g. GP surgery)	9.3%
Crime	Burglary, Theft, Criminal Damage, Violence	9.3%
Living Environment	Housing conditions, Air quality	9.3%

The IMD 2010 is based on small geographic areas known as Super Output Areas (SOAs). There are 32,482 SOAs in England, each with an average population of 1,500 people. There are several types of SOAs but lower layer SOAs are the ones used for the IMD.

Each SOA in England is scored for each domain of deprivation and receives and overall IMD 2010 score.

#### **Domains**

The Income Deprivation Domain measures the percentage of people living in low-income families and also includes two sub-domains:

- The IDACI score (Income Deprivation Affecting Children) is the proportion of children aged 0-15 years living in income-deprived households as a proportion of all children aged 0-15 years
- The IDAOPI score (Income Deprivation Affecting Older People)
  refers to adults aged 60 years or over living on Income Support or
  income-based Jobseeker's Allowance or Pension Credit (guarantee) as
  a proportion of all those aged 60 years or over

**The Employment Domain** measures the percentage of people who want to work but are unable to do so due to unemployment, sickness or disability.

The Health and Disability Domain identifies areas with relatively high rates of people who die prematurely, whose quality of life is impaired by poor health or who are disabled.

The Education, Skills and Training Domain measures the lack of qualifications among children and adults. It is made up of two sub-domains:

- Children and Young People
- Skills (working age adults)

The Barriers to Housing and Services Domain is made up of two subdomains:

- Wider Barriers: refers to issues relating to access to housing (overcrowding and affordability) and homelessness
- Geographical Barriers: measures poor geographical access to key services including GP surgery, supermarket, primary school and Post Office

The Crime and Disorder Domain measures the rate of recorded crime across four major crime themes (burglary, theft, criminal damage and violence).

**The Living Environment Domain** is divided into two sub-domains:

- The Indoor Living Environment sub-domain measures the quality of housing.
- The Outdoor Living Environment sub-domain contains measures about air quality and road traffic accidents.

# How The Scores are Analysed

Each SOA is ranked according to its score, from 1 (most deprived in England) to 32,482 (least deprived in England). These SOAs are then split into **national deprivation quintiles** (comparing scores across England). Unless specifically mentioned, these were used in this report.

To get a more meaningful local picture, each SOA in Shropshire County is ranked from 1 (most deprived in Shropshire) to 192 (least deprived in Shropshire). Shropshire SOAs are then divided into **local deprivation quintiles** (comparing SOAs within Shropshire County itself) which will be used for the future profiling and monitoring of health and social inequalities in Shropshire County.

Maps representing both national as well as local quintiles have been used in this report.

The results are then summarised at County level. The IMD 2010 scores together with these summaries are sometimes referred to as the ID 2010 (Indices of Deprivation).

## Comparability with IMD 2004 and IMD 2007

The IMD 2010 was designed to be a direct update to the IMD 2007 and, for the most part retains the same methodology, domains and indicators. Some small changes have been made to some indicators and to some indicator weights in order to retain consistency. These changes may have a small impact on the score and or rank of a domain, but for the most part IMD 2010 and IMD 2007 are comparable.

The IMD 2007 was designed to update IMD 2004, however, caution should be exercised for income domain score comparisons between 2007 and 2004 since there were major changes within this domain. IMD 2004 is not comparable to its predecessor, the IMD 2000, since significant changes were made to all its domains.

# **Population Denominator**

Population numbers for this report were taken from the GP registration system data (Exeter) for the years 2004, 2007 and 2010 rather than from the population estimates provided by the Department of Communities and Local Government. These numbers provide a more accurate picture of the population in each SOA for that specific year than the estimated population numbers do. For example: rather than using estimated population numbers from 2008 for IMD 2010 scores, population data from 2010 was used.

# **Important Points**

There are a few important points to note when interpreting IMD 2010 results. The IMD 2010 identifies areas with different concentrations of deprivation. Population numbers quoted in these results refer to those living in areas with a particular concentration of deprivation. It is therefore important to note that not all deprived people live in areas with high levels of deprivation and, conversely, not everyone living in a highly deprived area is deprived. It is also important to note that an area's index score rank is affected by the index score rank of other areas. It is therefore difficult to tell whether a change in score over time reflects a real change in the level of deprivation in that particular area or whether it is due to a change in the scores of the other areas it is being compared to.

Whenever interpreting data changes to a particular area, it is important to place this in the context of any knowledge of the local area. A good example of this is highlighted in the IMD 2010 technical report, where if one knows that a traffic calming scheme has been introduced to a particular area then one could be certain that a reduction in the number of road traffic accidents in that area can be confidently attributed to a real change.

# **Shropshire County Profile**

Shropshire is a diverse, large, predominantly rural inland county, situated in the West Midlands. With a population of 293,400 and a population density of 0.94 persons per hectare the County is one of the most sparsely populated in England. The County contains several small market towns; only four of these have a population of over 10,000 according to the 2001 Census. Shrewsbury is the County town, has the status of sub-regional foci in the adopted Regional Spatial Strategy (RSS) (a spatial strategy which sets out the region's policies in relation to the development and use of land and forms part of the County's development plan). In the emerging RSS, Shrewsbury is defined as a 'settlement of significant development'. The town is home to around a quarter of the County's population and is a key employment, shopping and cultural centre for Shropshire and mid-Wales, and a popular destination for tourists and visitors.

Shropshire's historic market towns provide jobs and a range of local shops and services for their resident communities and large rural hinterlands. The County's economy is based mainly on agriculture, tourism, food industries, healthcare and other public services.

Shropshire has strong links with the neighbouring unitary council, Telford & Wrekin. The eastern part of Shropshire also has strong connections with the West Midlands conurbation. Parts of North Shropshire have strong links with the Potteries and with towns in south Cheshire, and are also influenced by Merseyside and Manchester. Oswestry, the second largest town in Shropshire, has strong links with adjacent areas within Wales. The southern and western parts of the County are generally more remote and self-contained and have been identified as a Rural Regeneration Zone.

Shropshire has a rich and varied natural and historic environment. About one third of the County is upland, mostly to the south and west, the highest point being Brown Clee at 540 metres. Almost 81,000 hectares of the South Shropshire hills are designated as an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty and contain a variety of landscapes varying from arable farming to remote moorland and extensive woodlands (this includes 491 hectares in Telford and Wrekin). Approximately 2% of Shropshire is covered by Sites of Special Scientific Interest and woodland covers 7.7% of the land area.

# Key Facts

- In 2010 there were 293,400 people living in Shropshire, of which 145,100 were men and 148,300 women. (2010 Population Estimates Mid-2010 National Statistics)
- The 2009 Mid Year Population estimates indicate that 3.7% of Shropshire's population from black, mixed or from other minority ethnic groups (Source: 2009 Population Estimates, Mid-2009 National Statistics)

- Shropshire has 29% of its population aged over 60, and less than 24% are under 20. (2010 Population Estimates Mid-2010 National Statistics)
- Shropshire has a working age population of 179,300 people (61%). (2010 Population Estimates Mid-2010 National Statistics)
- There are 55,800 children (under 16) in the County, making up 19% of the total population. (2010 Population Estimates Mid-2010 National Statistics)
- Between July 2010 and June 2011, there were 140,600 economically active residents in Shropshire, and 34,500 economically inactive residents. (Annual Population Survey 2011, National Statistics)
- 19.9% of those employed work from home this is higher than the national and regional figures. (2001 Census, National Statistics)
- 53.6% of the households in Shropshire have 2 or more cars or vans, compared to 54.9% in England (*Census 2001, Office of National Statistics*).
- In 2001 there were 123,240 jobs in Shropshire and 135,465 resident workers. 76% of resident workers lived and worked in Shropshire. 83% of the jobs in Shropshire are filled by Shropshire residents. (2001 Census, National Statistics)
- The service sector is the largest employer in Shropshire, accounting for 82.4% of all jobs. Manufacturing accounts for 11.6%. (*Business Register, 2010, National Statistics*)
- The majority of companies in Shropshire are classified as being small, with 91.5% employing fewer than 10. However there are a number of major employers (with more than 250 employees) across the county. (Business Register, 2010, National Statistics)

- Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB) areas of national importance for their landscape character and appearance, within which conservation and enhancement of their natural beauty is a priority. These are designated under the Natural Parks and Access to the Countryside Act 1949 by the Secretary of State for the Environment.
- Greenbelt an area of land, usually around a city or conurbation within which there is a presumption against urban development.

# The Index of Multiple Deprivation 2010

#### SUMMARY

- In 2010, 2.8% of Shropshire County's population lived within the most deprived fifth of areas in England. This had increased by 0.7% since 2007.
- 14.6% lived within the least deprived fifth. This represents a 1.9% increase from 2007.
- Only five of Shropshire's SOAs fell within the most deprived fifth nationally.
   These were Harlescott, Meole Brace, Monkmoor, Battlefield and Heathgates and Market Drayton East.

This section refers to the overall IMD score, as outlined in the introduction.

## SHROPSHIRE COUNTY





Figure 3 Index of Multiple Deprivation 2004 and 2007 and 2010 by national quintile for Shropshire County

In 2010, 2.8% of Shropshire County's population lived within the most deprived fifth of areas in England. This increased by 0.7% since 2007. In contrast, in 2010, 14.6% of the population lived within the least deprived fifth. This represents a 1.9% increase from 2007 returning to the same levels seen in 2004 (Figure 3).

Since 2004, the largest proportion of Shropshire's population lived within areas in the 3<sup>rd</sup> most deprived quintile (39.1% in 2010) (Table 1).

Figure 2 Index of Multiple Deprivation 2010 in Shropshire County

#### SHROPSHIRE DISTRICTS

In 2010, **Shrewsbury and Atcham** was the district with the highest proportion (6.6%) of its population living within the most deprived fifth of areas nationally, this had increased by 3.3% from 2004. 2.8% of the population of **North Shropshire** lived within the most deprived fifth of areas in England. **South Shropshire** and **Bridgnorth** did not have any inhabitants living within these areas.

21.6% of **Bridgnorth** residents lived within the least deprived fifth of areas in England – this was the highest percentage out of all Shropshire Districts




Figure 4 IMD 2004 and 2007 and 2010 by national quintile for North Shropshire

Since 2007, **North Shropshire** has experienced an 8% decrease in the proportion of residents living within second least deprived fifth of areas in England and this reflected by the 8% increase in the proportion of residents living within the least deprived fifth. In 2010, 2.8% of the population were living in the most deprived fifth, whereas in 2004 and 2007 none this district's population fell in this quintile. The proportion falling in the second most deprived quintile is 3.9% higher in 2010 than it was in 2004 (Figure 4).



**Oswestry** has also shown a decrease of 10% of residents living in the second least deprived quintile with a subsequent increase of 6% in the proportion of residents living in the least deprived quintile. There has also been a decrease in the proportion of residents living in areas falling in the second most deprived quintile and an increase in the percentage of residents living in the third most deprived quintile.


None of **Oswestry's** residents fell in the in the most deprived quintile in 2010. The proportion of residents falling in the second most deprived quintile has increased by 2.3% since 2004 in overall terms. There have been drops in quintiles 3 and 4 from 2004 levels, and an increase of 3.5% in the least deprived quintile. These trends are shown in Figure 5.

Figure 5 IMD 2004 and 2007 and 2010 by national quintile for Oswestry




Since 2004, **Shrewsbury and Atcham** has experienced an increase in the proportion of residents living in areas in the two most deprived quintiles. There has been an increase of 3.3% in quintile 1, and an increase of 4.1% in quintile 2. Since 2004 there have been decreases in quintiles 3, 4 and 5 as shown in Figure 6.


Figure 7 IMD 2004 and 2007 and 2010 by national quintile for South Shropshire

The most notable change for **South Shropshire** since 2007 has been a increase of 5% in quintile 2, there have also been small decreases of 3% in both quintile 3 and in the least deprived quintile, quintile 5. The proportion of residents living in the second least deprived quintile has remained unchanged since 2004 (Figure 7).

**Bridgnorth** has experienced a very slight drop in second least deprived and the least deprived quintile. Quintile 2 also had a drop of 3%, restoring it back to 2004 levels. The most notable change was in quintile 3 which had an increase of 6%. None of the residents in **Bridgnorth** were in the most deprived quintile (

## SHROPSHIRE SOAs

Of the 192 SOAs in Shropshire, only 5 fell within the most deprived quintile nationally (Table 3). These were located within the electoral wards of Harlescott, Meole Brace, Monkmoor and Battlefield and Heathgates in Shrewsbury and Atcham District and Market Drayton East in North Shropshire. (The three most deprived SOAs are shown in Figure 2.)

The number of SOAs which fell into the least deprived quintile increased to 27 from 23 in 2007. The least deprived SOA in 2010 was in the ward of **Donington and Albrighton North** in the District of **Bridgnorth**. The ward of **Bridgnorth Castle** contained the least deprived SOA in 2007 and now holds the second least deprived SOA.

SOAs in the wards of **Monkmoor** in **Shrewsbury and Atcham** District and **Castle** in **Oswestry** District were in the most deprived quintile nationally in 2007. As of 2010, the ward of **Castle** in **Oswestry** District had become less deprived, falling in the second most deprived quintile nationally.

SOAs in the wards of **Monkmoor** in **Shrewsbury and Atcham** have remained in the most deprived quintile nationally and have been joined by SOAs in the wards of **Market Drayton East** in the district of **North Shropshire**, and **Battlefield and Heathgates**, **Meole Brace**, and **Harlescott** in the district of **Shrewsbury and Atcham**.

An SOA in the ward of **Masterfield** in **Oswestry** experienced the greatest improvement in terms of its deprivation levels. Its national percentile ranking rose from 68% in 2007 to 83% in 2010, which represents an increase from national quintile 4 to 5).

An SOA in the ward of **Montford** in **Shrewsbury and Atcham District** experienced the greatest decline in terms of deprivation levels, with its national percentile ranking falling from 72% in 2007 to 59% in 2007 (A drop from quintile 4 to 3).



# **Income Deprivation**

#### SUMMARY

- In 2010, 4.6% of Shropshire's population, 4.4% of children and 4.4% of older people lived in income deprivation (The lowest fifth nationally).
- Overall, **Shrewsbury and Atcham** had the highest proportion of its population living in income deprivation in Shropshire (6.6%) and **North Shropshire** had the lowest (2.8%).
- The most deprived SOA overall was in Harlescott and the least deprived SOA was in Donington and Albrighton North.
- The most deprived SOA for income deprivation affecting children was in Market Drayton East and the most deprived SOA for income deprivation affecting older people was in Gobowen in the district of Oswestry.

Income deprivation is considered to be one of the most important aspects of deprivation and subsequently is given a weighting of 22.5%. This domain measures the percentage of people living in low-income households.

The income deprivation domain includes two sub-domains:

- Income Deprivation Affecting Children Index (IDACI) this
  measures the proportion of children under the age of 16 who are living
  in families in receipt of means-tested benefits or in families in receipt of
  Income Support or income based Jobseeker's Allowance or Pension
  Credit (Guarantee) or those not in receipt of these benefits but in
  receipt of Child Tax Credit with an equivalent income (excluding
  housing benefits) below 60% of the median income before housing
  costs
- Income Deprivation Affecting Older People Index (IDAOPI) this
  measures the percentage of the population aged over 60 years who
  are living on Income Support, Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance or
  Pension Credit (Guarantee)

The following indicators have been used to calculate the income deprivation scores:

- Adults and children in Income Support Households
- Adults and children in Income-Based Job Seekers Allowance Households
- Adults and children in Pension Credit (Guarantee) Households
- Adults and children in Child Tax Credit Households (who are not claiming Income Support, Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance or Pension Credit) whose equivalent income (excluding housing benefits) is below 60% of the median before housing costs
- Asylum seekers in England in receipt of subsistence support, accommodation support, or both

There have been no changes to indicators since IMD 2007 however caution should be exercised around making comparisons between IMD 2007 and IMD

2004 for the income domain, since some indicators used in the IMD 2007 have been altered following major changes to the social security system.

#### SHROPSHIRE COUNTY

## **Income Deprivation Overall**

The proportion of people living in income deprivation has been increasing steadily since 2004 when it was 3.2% of the population of Shropshire. In 2007 the proportion had increased slightly to 3.6%. By 2010, the proportion of people living in income deprivation (the lowest national quintile) in Shropshire had increased by a further 1% to 4.6% (Table 4).

#### **Income Deprivation Affecting Children**

In 2004, 5.0% of children under the age of 16 in Shropshire were living in income deprivation (the most deprived fifth of children nationally). By 2007 this proportion dropped to 3.1%. Between 2007 and 2010, the proportion of children living in income deprivation increased by 1.3% to 4.4% (Table 4).

## **Income Deprivation Affecting Older People**

The proportion of people aged over 60 years who were found to be living in income deprivation in 2004 was 4.1%. In 2007 this proportion dropped to 1.4% but. Between 2007 and 2010 this proportion had increased to above 2004 levels to 4.4% (Table 4).

## Figure 10 Income Deprivation in Shropshire County




Figure 11 Income Deprivation affecting Children in Shropshire County





Figure 12 Income Affecting Older people in Shropshire County



## SHROPSHIRE DISTRICTS

#### **Income Deprivation Overall**

Since 2004 **Shrewsbury and Atcham** has consistently remained the most deprived District in Shropshire. In 2004, 6.5% of the population fell in the most deprived quintile nationally. By 2007 this proportion had only increased incrementally by 0.1% to 6.6% and remained at that level in 2010. In 2004 the districts of both **Bridgnorth** and **Oswestry** were considered to be the least deprived districts in Shropshire with none of their populations falling with in the most deprived income quintile nationally. By 2007 this remained the case for the district of **Bridgnorth**. Income deprivation increased in **Oswestry** with 2.8% of its population falling into the most deprived quintile. By 2010 both **North Shropshire** and **Oswestry** had become the least deprived districts in Shropshire in terms of Income, with both districts having only 2.8% of their population falling into the most deprived quintile (Table 5).

## **Income Deprivation Affecting Children**

Since 2004, **Shrewsbury and Atcham** has consistently remained the most deprived district in Shropshire with respect to Income deprivation affecting children. In 2004, 8.8% of **Shrewsbury and Atcham's** population of children under the age of 16 fell in the most deprived quintile nationally. This proportion dropped by 1.6% to 7.2% in 2007 before increasing above 2004 levels to 9.1% in 2010.

In 2004, the district of **Bridgnorth** was the least deprived district with none of its population falling in the most deprived quintile nationally. This has remained the case in both 2007 and in 2010. In 2007, in addition to **Bridgnorth**, neither **North Shropshire** nor **Oswestry's** populations fell within the most deprived quintile nationally. By 2010, **Oswestry** and **Bridgnorth** remained the least deprived districts in the county and **North Shropshire** 

district's population had returned to 2004 levels with 3.0% of its population falling within the most deprived quintile nationally (Table 6).

## **Income Deprivation Affecting Older People**

In 2004, **Shrewsbury and Atcham** was the most deprived district in Shropshire in terms of Income affecting people aged 60 and older with 5.8% of its population falling in the most deprived quintile nationally. **North Shropshire** and **Oswestry** districts followed very closely behind **Shrewsbury and Atcham** both with 5.3% of their populations falling in the most deprived quintile nationally.

By 2007, **Oswestry** had become the most deprived district with 11.7% of its population now falling within the most deprived quintile. This represents an increase of 6.4%. In addition the proportion of **Shrewsbury and Atcham** district's population of people aged 60 and over living in income deprivation increased by 1.4% to 7.2%. **Oswestry** district remained the most deprived district in 2010 with 9.7% of its population of older people living with income deprivation. This does however represent a drop of 2% from 2007 levels. The proportion of older people living with income deprivation in the **Shrewsbury and Atcham** district dropped to 4.7%. In 2010, however the district of **Bridgnorth** experienced a doubling of its older population living with income deprivation to 4.8%.

**South Shropshire** district has consistently remained the least deprived district in Shropshire since 2004 when none of its population was within the most deprived quintile. In 2007, 1.9% of its population aged 60 year and older were income deprived and this dropped to 1.7% in 2010 (Table 7).

#### SHROPSHIRE SOAs

#### **Income Deprivation Overall**

The number of SOAs in the most deprived quintile nationally has steadily increased since 2004. In 2004 there were six SOA in the lowest quintile, this increased to seven in 2007 and to nine in 2010.

In 2010, there were nine SOAs within the most deprived quintile nationally (Table 8). These were located within Harlescott, Monkmoor, Meole Brace and Battlefield and Heathgate in Shrewsbury and Atcham, Ludlow Henley and Stokesay in South Shropshire, the Market Drayton East in North Shropshire, Gobowen in Oswestry and Highley in Bridgnorth. (The three most deprived SOAs are shown in Figure 10.)

There were 25 SOAs in the least deprived fifth nationally in 2004, this number dropped to 22 in 2007 but has increased to 27 in 2010 (Table 8). In 2010, the least deprived SOA was in **Donington and Albrighton North** in **Bridgnorth**. This SOA was located in the 99<sup>th</sup> percentile nationally this has remained unchanged since 2004.

The greatest increase in deprivation levels from 2004 until 2010 was recorded in an SOA located in the **Stokesay** in **South Shropshire**. This SOA dropped from the 37<sup>th</sup> percentile nationally down to the 16<sup>th</sup> percentile (this represents a drop from quintile 2 to quintile 1).


The greatest decrease in levels of income deprivation from 2004 until 2010 was seen in an SOA located in **Maserfield** in **Oswestry**. This SOA jumped from the 61<sup>st</sup> percentile nationally in 2004 to the 81<sup>st</sup> percentile in 2010. This change represents a jump up from the fourth quintile to the fifth quintile. From 2007 until 2010 the greatest increase in deprivation levels was seen in an SOA in **Castle** in **Oswestry**. This SOA dropped from the 72<sup>nd</sup> percentile nationally to the 52<sup>nd</sup>; this represents a drop from the fourth quintile down to the third quintile. The greatest decrease in deprivation level between 2007 and 2010 was seen in a SOA in **Maserfield** in **Oswestry**. This SOA jumped from 60<sup>th</sup> percentile in 2007 to the 81<sup>st</sup> percentile in 2010, a move from quintile 3 to quintile 5.

## **Income Deprivation Affecting Children**

The number of SOAs within the most deprived quintile nationally has declined slightly since 2004. In 2004, there were 7 SOA in the most deprived quintile, this number dropped to 4 in 2007 but has since increased to 6 SOA in 2010. The six SOAs which fall in the most deprived quintile nationally for 2010 were located in Harlescott, Monkmoor, Meole Brace and Battlefield and Heathgates in Shrewsbury and Atcham, Ludlow Henley in South Shropshire and Market Drayton East in North Shropshire. (The three most deprived SOAs are shown in Figure 11.)

In 2004, there were 39 SOAs in least deprived fifth nationally. This number fell to 33 in 2007, but by 2010 returned back to 2004 levels to 39 (

Table 9). In 2010 the least deprived SOA was in **Porthill** in **Shrewsbury and Atcham** district. This SOA fell within the 98<sup>th</sup> percentile nationally. In 2007 this SOA was in the 99<sup>th</sup> percentile.

The greatest decline in deprivation from 2004 to 2010 occurred in an SOA in the **Worfield** in the district of **Bridgnorth**. This SOA fell from the 86<sup>th</sup> percentile nationally to the 54<sup>th</sup> percentile; this represents a drop from least deprived quintile nationally to third quintile.


The greatest improvement in terms of income deprivation affecting children from 2004 to 2010 was seen in an SOA located in **Hinstock** in **North Shropshire**. Since 2004 this SOA has moved up 28 percentiles from the 39<sup>th</sup> percentile to the 68<sup>th</sup> percentile nationally, and this represents a jump from the second most deprived fifth nationally to the second least deprived fifth. The greatest change in deprivation levels from 2007 to 2010 was seen an SOA located in **Gobowen** in **Oswestry**, where the levels of income deprivation affecting children under the age of 15 years increased substantially. This SOA dropped from the 95<sup>th</sup> percentile nationally down to the 68<sup>th</sup> percentile, representing a drop from the least deprived quintile to the second least deprived quintile.

#### **Income Deprivation Affecting Older People**

Since 2004 there has been an increase in income deprivation affecting older people in Shropshire. In 2004 there were nine SOAs which fell in the most deprived quintile nationally. This number increased to 13 in 2007 and by 2010 there were still 12 SOA in most deprived quintile.

The 12 most deprived SOAs in Shropshire in 2010 were situated in the following wards: Bridgnorth West and Shifnal Idsall in Bridgnorth, Whitchurch North in North Shropshire, Cabin Lane, Carreg Llwyd, Gobowen, and Gatacre in Oswestry, Stokesay in South Shropshire and Harlescott, Monkmoor, Meole Brace and Castlefields and Quarry in Shrewsbury and Atcham. (The three most deprived SOAs are shown in Figure 12.)

Since 2004, the number of SOAs falling in the least deprived quintile nationally has increased from 22 to 31 in 2007 and to 35 by 2010 (Table 10). The least deprived SOA in 2010 was located in **Caynham and Ashford** in **South Shropshire**. This SOA moved from the 88<sup>th</sup> percentile nationally in 2004, to 91<sup>st</sup> percentile in 2007. By 2010 it was ranked in the 98<sup>th</sup> percentile. Since 2004, this SOA has consistently remained in the least deprived quintile nationally.

An SOA in **Bucknell** in **South Shropshire** experienced the largest decline in terms of income deprivation between 2004 and 2010. Its national percentile ranking dropped from 84% in 2004 to 59% in 2010, this represents a drop from quintile 5 down to quintile 3.


The greatest improvement in terms of income deprivation affecting older people was seen in an SOA in **Whittington** in **Oswestry**. It jumped from 35<sup>th</sup> national percentile to the 76<sup>th</sup>, representing a change from the second most deprived national quintile to the fourth most deprived.

## **Employment Deprivation**

#### SUMMARY

- In 2010, 6.6% of Shropshire's population lived in areas which are employment deprived (the most deprived quintile nationally)
- This proportion has increased steadily since 2004
- Shrewsbury and Atcham had the highest levels of employment deprivation and Bridgnorth had the lowest
- An SOA in **Harlescot**t in **Shrewsbury and Atcham** had the highest levels of deprivation for employment in Shropshire

The Employment Deprivation domain is also considered to be one of the most important facets of deprivation and is weighted at 22.5%. This domain measures the percentage of the working age population who want to work but are unable to do so due to unemployment, sickness or disability. Seven indicators were used to calculate the employment deprivation scores:

- Claimants of Jobseeker's Allowance (both contribution-based and income-based), women aged 18-59 and men aged 18-64
- Claimants of Incapacity Benefit aged 18-59/64
- Claimants of Severe Disablement Allowance aged 18-59/64
- Claimants of Employment and Support Allowance aged 18-59/64 (those with a contribution-based element)
- Participants in New Deal for 18-24s who are not claiming Jobseeker's Allowance
- Participants in New Deal 25+ who are not claiming Jobseeker's Allowance
- Participants in New Deal for Lone Parents aged 18 and over (after initial interview)

#### SHROPSHIRE COUNTY




Figure 17 Employment Deprivation in Shropshire County by National Quintile for 2004, 2007 and 2010

In 2010, 6.6% of Shropshire's population were living in areas which fell into the most deprived fifth nationally in terms of employment. Table 11 and Figure 17 show that there has been a steady increase since 2004, from 2.5% to 4.8% in 2007 and 6.6% in 2010.

The proportion of Shropshire's population living in areas which fell in the least deprived fifth increased from 4.6% in 2004 to 8.0% in 2010.


In 2010, quintile 4 was the most populated quintile containing 33.6% of the county's population. Since 2004, quintile 4 has consistently remained the most populated quintile, although the proportion had dropped form 39.9% in 2004 down to 33.6% in 2010 (Table 11)

The most deprived SOAs are labelled in yellow

#### SHROPSHIRE DISTRICTS

The two districts with the highest proportions of their populations falling in the most deprived quintile were **Shrewsbury and Atcham** district and **Oswestry** district with 11.2% and 9.1% respectively. None of the inhabitants in **Bridgnorth** fell in the most deprived quintile.

The proportion of **Shrewsbury and Atcham's** population living in the most deprived fifth nationally had more than tripled since 2004. In 2004 the proportion was 3.3%, this increased to 8.0% in 2007 and then to 11.2% in 2010.

In 2010, **South Shropshire** had the largest proportion of its inhabitants falling in the least deprived fifth nationally, 15.8%. In 2004, **South Shropshire** had none of its inhabitants falling in the least deprived quintile, this number increased to 3.9% in 2007 and then jumped to 15.8% by 2010.


The numbers and percentages of the district populations are described in Table 12 by national quintile. In 2010, only **Bridgnorth** had no inhabitants in the most deprived quintile. All five districts contained inhabitants in the least deprived quintile. **Bridgnorth** had the highest percentage which was 17.1%. This figure has remained fairly consistent since 2004 (16.1% in 2004 and 16.6% in 2007).


In **North Shropshire** there was an increase from 15.1% in 2007 to 24.8% in 2010 in the second quintile. There were subsequent decreases between 2007 and 2010 in quintiles 3 and 4. There was a drop from 41.8% to 36.2% in quintile 3 and a drop from 37.6% to 31.3% in quintile 4. The proportion of inhabitants falling in the least deprived quintile has steadily increased from 1.9% in 2004 to 4.9% in 2010. These trends are displayed in Figure 18.

Figure 18 Employment Deprivation in North Shropshire by National Quintile for 2004, 2007 and 2010




In **Oswestry**, there has been a steady drop in the proportion of the population falling in quintile 3. The proportions have fallen from 31.1% in 2004 to 21.6% in 2010. There has also been a subsequent increase in proportions of the population falling in the second least deprived quintile (quintile 4). The proportions increased from 24.5% in 2004 to 31% in 2010. Between 2007 and 2010 there was a drop of 1.6% in quintile 2 and increases of 1.5% and 2.6% in quintiles 1 and 5 respectively. Between 2007 and 2010, the levels in the most deprived quintile rose from 7.6% to 9.1%. The trends can be seen in Figure 19.






Since 2007, in **Shrewsbury and Atcham**, there have been increases in the proportions in quintiles 1, 2 and 4. There were decreases in quintiles 3 and 5. The greatest drop was seen in quintile 3, a drop from 34.8% down to 24.4% there were subsequent increases in the more deprived quintiles, an increase of 3.2% in the most deprived quintile and 6.8% in quintile 2. Between 2007 and 2010 there was also a decrease of 6.3% in the least deprived quintile (Figure 20).

Since 2004, **South Shropshire** has shown an increase in the second most deprived quintile from 11.7% in 2004 to 21.2% in 2010. The most deprived quintile has remained at a consistent level since 2004 (2.9%). There has been a slight increase in the third quintile increasing from 22% to 31.2% in 2010, it remains however, lower than 2004 levels. There has been a large drop in the fourth quintile, from 52.8% in 2007 down to 29%, and in 2010, there was a subsequent increase in the least deprived quintile (quintile 5) from 3.9% in 2007 to 15.8% in 2010 (Figure 21).




Figure 22 Employment Deprivation in Bridgnorth by national quintile in 2004, 2007 and 2010

In Bridgnorth, since 2004, there were no inhabitants in the most deprived quintile. There has been very little change in the profile of employment deprivation since 2004 ( Figure 22).

### SHROPSHIRE SOAs

In 2010, there were a total of 13 SOAs which fell in the most deprived quintile nationally. This number has increased from five in 2004 to nine in 2007. Of these 13, three fell in bottom 10% nationally; these are located in the wards of **Harlescott** and **Monkmoor** in **Shrewsbury and Atcham**, and **Castle** in **Oswestry**. (The three most deprived SOAs are shown in Figure 16.) In 2010, there were 17 SOAs in the least deprived quintile nationally. This number increased from 10 in 2004 to 15 in 2007. There were two SOAs which fell in the 10% least deprived in the country. These were located in **Caynham and Ashford** in **South Shropshire** and **Donington and Albrighton North** in **Bridgnorth** (Table 13).

Two SOAs, one located in the ward of **Highley** in **Bridgnorth** and **Stokesay** in **South Shropshire** experienced the greatest decline since 2004, each dropping 22% in national percentile rankings. **Highley's** ranking dropped from 82% down to 60% (representing a drop from the fifth quintile to the third quintile), and **Stokesay** dropped from 49% down to 27% (representing a drop from the third quintile down to the second quintile).

The SOA which showed the greatest improvement since 2004 was located in **Underdale** in **Shrewsbury and Atcham**. Its national percentile rankings have improved by 26% jumping from 34% in 2004 to 60% in 2010 (this represents

and jump from the second most deprived quintile to the second least deprived quintile).

## **Health Deprivation and Disability**

#### SUMMARY

- In 2010, nearly eight percent (7.7%) of Shropshire's population lived in the most deprived fifth of areas in England, this has increased dramatically from 2.1% in 2007 and 1.5% in 2004
- 13.9% of the county's population lived in the least deprived fifth of areas in England
- An SOA in Meole Brace in Shrewsbury and Atcham was the most deprived SOA in the county in terms of health deprivation and disability

This domain identifies areas with relatively high rates of people who die prematurely, whose quality of life is impaired by poor health or who are disabled. The scores are derived from four measures:

- Years of Potential Life Lost: An age and sex standardised measure of premature death (2004-2008)
- Comparative Illness and Disability Ratio: An age and sex standardised morbidity/disability ratio (2008)
- Acute morbidity: An age and sex standardised rate of emergency admission to hospital (2006-2008)
- Mood and anxiety disorders: The rate of adults suffering from mood and anxiety disorders (2004-2008)

#### SHROPSHIRE COUNTY

In 2010, nearly eight percent (7.7%) of Shropshire's population lived in areas within the most deprived fifth nationally in terms of Health Deprivation and Disability. This proportion more than tripled since 2007 when it was just over two percent (2.1%). The proportion of Shropshire's population living in the least deprived fifth of areas nationally has also more than tripled from four percent in 2007 to 13.9% in 2010 (Table 14).

Quintile 4, the second least deprived fifth nationally, was the most populated quintile, containing 33.9% of the county's population. This has remained the most populated quintile since 2004. The overall proportion of Shropshire's population living in quintile 4 dropped from 43.9% in 2007 down to 33.9% in 2010 (Table 14).






Figure 25 Health Deprivation and Disability in Shropshire County by National Quintile in 2004, 2007 and 2010

Since 2007, the largest increases in proportions of the population have been seen in the most deprived quintile (quintile 1) and the least deprived quintile (quintile 5) with increases of 5.6% and 9.9% respectively. This can be seen in Figure 25.


#### SHROPSHIRE DISTRICTS

In 2010, **Shrewsbury and Atcham** and **South Shropshire** were the only two districts with a proportion of their population living in the most deprived fifth nationally in terms of health and disability deprivation. The proportion of **Shrewsbury and Atcham's** population living in the most deprived fifth in England increased from 3.2% in 2004 to 6.2% in 2007 and then jumped more than three times to 21.7% in 2010. The proportion living in the most deprived fifth in terms of health deprivation in **South Shropshire** was 2.9% in 2004, this dropped to 0% in 2007 but in 2010 it returned to 2.8%.


The numbers and percentages of district populations are described by national quintile in Table 15. In 2010 there were three districts which contained inhabitants in the least deprived quintile. These were **Bridgnorth** with 56.7% (22.8% in 2004 and 19.9% in 2007), **Oswestry** with 15.5% (0% in 2004 and 4.2% in 2007), and **North Shropshire** with 9.1% (0% in both 2004 and 2007).


Since 2004, **North Shropshire** experienced a drop in the proportion of inhabitants within quintile 3. In 2004, 53% of this district's population were in quintile 3 but by 2010, this dropped to 23.6%. This decrease has been matched by an increase in proportion of those inhabitants within quintile 4. There were 33.9% of the districts population in quintile 4 in 2004 and this had increased to 51.8% by 2010. The trends are shown in Figure 26.






Between 2004 and 2007 the general trend in **Oswestry** was a move away from the more deprived quintiles and towards the less deprived. As shown in Figure 27, this trend has continued through to 2010. Between 2007 and 2010 there have been decreases in the proportions in quintiles 2 and 3 and increases in the proportions in quintiles 4 and 5. There was a notable increase in the least deprived quintile from 4.2% in 2007 to 15.5% of the population in 2010.






In contrast to **Oswestry**, the trend in **Shrewsbury and Atcham** was a move towards the more deprived quintiles. Since 2004, none of the district's inhabitants have fallen within the top or least deprived quintile. In addition, there has been a very large decrease in the proportion of inhabitants falling in quintile 4. There was a drop from 44.4% in 2004 to a mere 13.7% by 2010. Also notable was a marked increase in the proportion of inhabitants in the most deprived quintile, an increase from 3.2% in 2004 to 21.7% in 2010 (Figure 28).

Figure 28 Health Deprivation and Disability in Shrewsbury and Atcham by National Quintile in 2004, 2007 and 2010




From 2004 to 2007, **South Shropshire** district experienced a decrease in those living in quintile 3 and a subsequent increase in those living in quintile 2. For the period from 2007 to 2010, the most noticeable change was a reduction of those living in quintile 4, from 67% to 50% and for a subsequent increase in the proportion of those living within quintile 3 from 12.1% in 2007 to more than double (25.8%) in 2010. In 2010, only 5.4% of **South Shropshire's** population lived in areas in the most deprived quintile (Figure 29).

Within the **Bridgnorth** district there was very little change from 2004 to 2007. From 2007 to 2010 there has been a general shift to less deprived quintiles. The most noticeable change was for the period from 2007 to 2010 was a reduction in quintile 4 from 57% to 32.6% and a subsequent increase in proportion for those living in quintile 5 where the proportion increased by nearly 3 times from 19.8% in 2007 to 56.7% in 2010 (Figure 30).

#### SHROPSHIRE SOAs

In 2010, there were a total of 14 SOAs in Shropshire which fell in the most deprived quintile nationally. This number has more than tripled from 2007 levels (3 SOAs in 2004 to 4 SOAs in 2007). Thirteen of the 14 SOAs are located in **Shrewsbury and Atcham**, and were: **Meole Brace**, **CasItefields and Quarry**, **Monkmoor**, **Sutton and Reabrook**, **Underdale**, **Sundorne**, **Bagley**, **Battlefield and Heathgates**, **Bowbrook**, and **Harlescott**. One of these SOAs was located in the ward of **Stokesay** in **South Shropshire**. (The three most deprived SOAs are shown in Figure 24.)

The most deprived SOA in Shropshire in 2010 was an SOA in **Meole Brace** in **Shrewsbury and Atcham**, the second most deprived was an SOA in **Harlescott**. This was the most deprived in 2004 and 2007, but moved into second last place in 2010.

In 2010, there were 26 SOAs in the least deprived quintile nationally, this is just under three times the number recorded for 2007 (9 SOAs). Nineteen of these SOAs were located in **Bridgnorth**, three in **North Shropshire** and four in **Oswestry** (

Table 16). The least deprived SOA in the county remained unchanged since 2007 and was located in the ward of **Morville** in **Bridgnorth**. This SOA fell within the 95<sup>th</sup> percentile nationally.


An SOA located in the ward of **Bayston Hill** in **Shrewsbury and Atcham** has shown the greatest decline in terms of Health Deprivation and Disability. This SOA dropped 29%from the 60<sup>th</sup> percentile in 2004 to the 31<sup>st</sup> percentile nationally in 2010 (which represents a drop from quintile 4 down to quintile 2). The greatest improvement in Health Deprivation and Disability was seen in an SOA in **Kinnerley** in **Oswestry**. Its national percentile ranking increased from 43% in 2004 to 63% in 2007 and up to 82% by 2010. This represents a climb from the third most deprived quintile nationally to the least deprived quintile.

## **Education, Skills and Training Deprivation**

#### SUMMARY

- In 2010, 11.4% of Shropshire's population lived within the most deprived fifth of areas in England and 19.1% lived within the least deprived fifth. An SOA in Harlescott in Shrewsbury and Atcham is the most deprived overall
- In terms of the children and young people's subdomain, 8.4% of the county's population lived within the most deprived fifth of areas in England and 24.3% lived within the least deprived fifth
- Among working aged adults with no or low qualifications, 13.3% of the county's population lived in areas within the most deprived fifth nationally and 8.7% lived within the least deprived fifth

This domain measures deprivation in terms of lack of educational attainment, skills and training for children and adults.

The education, skills and training deprivation domain includes two subdomains:

- Children and Young People scores are derived from the following indicators:
  - Average test scores of pupils at Key Stage 2 (2006-2008)
  - Average test scores of pupils at Key Stage 3 (2006-2008)
  - The average capped points score of pupils taking Key Stage 4 (GCSE or equivalent) exams (2006-2008)
  - Secondary School absence rate (2007-2009)
  - Proportion of young people not staying on in school or nonadvanced education above age 16 (2009)
  - Proportion of those aged under 21 not entering higher education (2005-2009)
- **Skills** this relates to the working age adult population. Only one indicator is used to measure this:
  - Proportion of working age adults aged 25-54 with no or low qualifications (2001)

#### SHROPSHIRE COUNTY

#### **Education, Skills and Training Deprivation Overall**




Figure 33 Education, Skills and Training in Shropshire County by National Quintile in 2004, 2007 and 2010

In 2004, 7.7% of the county's population lived in the most deprived fifth nationally and 21% lived in the least deprived fifth. By 2010 the proportion of Shropshire's population living with education deprivation had risen slightly to 11.4%. The most deprived quintile has consistently remained the least populated quintile since 2004, and the second least deprived quintile, quintile 4, has consistently remained the most populated. Figure 33 shows that the

distribution of Shropshire's population has remained fairly consistent since 2004 except for a slight rise in those in the least deprived quintile from 2007 to 2010. The percentages and absolute numbers for each year are presented in Table 17.

The most deprived SOAs are labelled in yellow

# Education, Skills and Training Deprivation Affecting Children and Young People





Figure 35 Education, Skills and Training Deprivation Affecting Children and Young People in Shropshire County by National Quintile in 2004, 2007 and 2010

In 2010, 8.4% of Shropshire's population lived in areas within the most deprived fifth of areas in England in terms of Education, Skills and Training deprivation affecting children and young people. 24.3% of the county's population lived in the least deprived fifth. The most populated quintile was quintile 4 which is the second least deprived quintile with 29.4%. Figure 35 shows that since 2004 there was an increase in the percentage of the county's population falling in the two most deprived quintiles, 1 and 2, and there was also a drop in the percentage of the population falling in the least deprived quintiles, quintiles 4 and 5.




In 2010, **Shrewsbury and Atcham** district had the largest proportion (15.0%) of its population living in the most deprived fifth nationally, Interestingly, it was also the district with the largest proportion (38.3%) living in the least deprived nationally. **North Shropshire** district had the smallest proportion of its inhabitants (7.8%) living in the most deprived fifth of areas nationally (Table 20).

**North Shropshire** has shown very little change since 2004. There have been slight increases in the proportions for quintiles 1 and 2 and a slight decrease in quintile 3. In the most deprived quintile, between 2007 and 2010 there was an increase of 2.7%. For quintiles 4 and 5, there was a slight increase from 2004 to 2007 however proportions in 2010 have returned to 2004 levels. These trends are shown in Figure 38.





In **Oswestry**, there appears to have been a shift away from the more deprived quintiles. Between 2004 and 2010 the proportion in the most deprived quintile fell by 3.7%. A subsequent increase of 3.3% between 2004 and 2010 was seen in quintile 2. The drop of 5.9% in the third quintile between 2004 and 2010 was mirrored by the increases of 2.4% in the fourth quintile and 3.8% in the fifth quintile in the same years. 


In **Shrewsbury and Atcham** district, since 2004, there have been increases in quintiles 1, 3 and 5 and there have been decreases in quintiles 2 and 4. 




Figure 43 Education Skills and Training Deprivation Affecting Children and Young People in North Shropshire by National Quintile



Figure 44 Education Skills and Training Deprivation Affecting Children and Young People in Oswestry by National Quintile





Figure 47 Education Skills and Training Deprivation Affecting Children and Young People in Bridgnorth by National Quintile



**Oswestry** district has the largest proportion of its population living among the most deprived quintile nationally (17.2%) and **North Shropshire** has the smallest proportion (10.3%). **Shrewsbury and Atcham** was the district with the largest proportion of their population living in the least deprived quintile nationally, at 19.9% (Table 22).

### SHROPSHIRE SOAs

### **Education, Skills and Training Deprivation Overall**

In 2010, in Shropshire, 22 of the 192 SOAs within the county fell within the most deprived quintile nationally. This number increased from 15 in 2004 and 13 in 2007. Four of these SOAs were among the 10% most deprived nationally. These areas were located in Harlescott, Battlefield and Heathgates, Meole Brace, in the district of Shrewsbury and Atcham and Market Drayton East in the district of North Shropshire. (The three most deprived SOAs are shown in Figure 32.)

In 2010, as in 2007, three SOAs in the **Shrewsbury and Atcham** district, two within **Porthill** and one within **Underdale** were among the least deprived in England. This highlights a sharp contrast between some of the most deprived and least deprived regions of the town of Shrewsbury.

In 2010, there were 34 SOAs in Shropshire which fell within the least deprived quintile nationally. This number has decreased, in 2004 there were 39 SOAs in this quintile and in 2007 there were 40. In 2010 the least deprived SOA in the county was located in **Porthill** in **Shrewsbury and Atcham** district. This has remained the least deprived area since 2004 and has consistently remained within the 99<sup>th</sup> percentile nationally.

The greatest decline in terms of deprivation since 2004 was seen in an SOA located within **Donington and Albrighton North** in **Bridgnorth**. This SOA dropped from the 87<sup>th</sup> percentile nationally to the 67<sup>th</sup> percentile which represents a fall from the least deprived quintile to the second least deprived quintile.


In contrast to this, the SOA which has shown the greatest improvement in terms of deprivation for education, skills and training overall was located in **West Wem** in **North Shropshire** district. This SOA increased its national percentile ranking by 15% from 45% in 2004 to 60% in 2010 (a jump from quintile 3 to quintile 4).

# Education, Skills and Training Deprivation Affecting Children and Young People

In 2010, there were 16 SOAs in Shropshire that were among the most deprived fifth of areas nationally. This number increased from 6 in 2004 to 8 in 2007 and then doubled to 16 in 2010. Three of these SOAs fell within the 10% most deprived in England and these areas are located in **Harlescott** and **Battlefield and Heathgates** in **Shrewsbury and Athcam** district and in **Market Drayton East** in **North Shropshire** district. (The three most deprived SOAs are shown in Figure 34.)

The number of SOAs within the least deprived fifth in England increased from 51 in 2004 to 56 in 2007. Since then this number has decreased by 12 to 44 in 2010. An SOA located in **Porthill** in **Shrewsbury and Atcham** is the least deprived area in Shropshire falling within the 100<sup>th</sup> percentile nationally. It has remained at this position since 2007.

The SOA demonstrating the greatest decline in terms of deprivation in education, skills and training affecting children and young people was located in **Bridgnorth West** in **Bridgnorth**. This area dropped from the 64<sup>th</sup> percentile nationally in 2004 to 29<sup>th</sup> percentile in 2010, representing a fall from quintile 4 down to quintile 2.

The greatest improvement in terms of deprivation between 2004 and 2010 was seen in an SOA located in **Wem West** in **North Shropshire**. This SOA's national percentile ranking rose from 47% in 2004 to 80% in 2010. This SOA moved from the 3<sup>rd</sup> quintile to the least deprived quintile (5<sup>th</sup> quintile).



Within the county of Shropshire, A total of 26 SOAs fell within the most deprived fifth nationally. Two of these SOAs fell within the 5% most deprived areas nationally, they were **Meole Brace** and **Harlescott** both located within the **Shrewsbury and Atcham** district. (The three most deprived SOAs are shown in Figure 36.)

Sixteen SOAs were among the least deprived fifth nationally. An SOA located in **Porthill** in **Shrewsbury and Atcham** was the least deprived in Shropshire with a national percentile ranking of 96%.



# **Barriers to Housing and Services**

### SUMMARY

- Barriers to Housing and Services Overall:
  - In 2010, over one third (34.4%) of Shropshire's population lived within the most deprived areas in England in terms of Barriers to Housing and Services. Under one fifth of the county's population (17.5%) lived in areas which fell among the least deprived fifth of areas in England
  - 44.3% of South Shropshire's population lived in areas that are in the most deprived quintile
  - SOAs located in Lawley, Bitterley with Stoke St. Milborough and Corve Valley are the most deprived in the county and have been since 2004
- Wider Barriers Sub-domain:
  - In 2010, 3.0% of the county's population lived in the most deprived fifth of areas nationally and 19.5% lived in the least deprived fifth
  - Shrewsbury and Atcham was the only district in Shropshire with any inhabitants in the most deprived quintile (9.0%)
  - The 5 most deprived SOAs were located in Underdale,
     Harlescott, Castlefields and Quarry, and Bowbrook all within the Shrewsbury and Atcham district
- Geographical Barriers Sub-domain:
  - In 2010, 43.8% of the county's population lived in areas which were among the most deprived fifth nationally and just 10.3% of lived in the least deprived fifth of areas nationally
  - In 2010, South Shropshire had the highest proportion of inhabitants living in areas in the most deprived quintile (61.8%)
  - The 5 most deprived SOAs were located in Corve Valley, Bitterley with Stoke St. Milborough, and Upper Corvedale in South Shropshire and Lawley within Shrewsbury and Atcham

Barriers to housing and services domain includes two sub-domains:

- Wider barriers this includes issues relating to access to housing, such as overcrowding and affordability, as well as homelessness. The scores are derived from the following indicators:
  - Household overcrowding (2001)
  - Homelessness the rate of acceptances for housing assistance under the homelessness provisions of housing legislation (2008-2009)
  - Housing affordability the difficulty of access to owneroccupation (2008)

- Geographical barriers this measures poor geographical access to key services that are important for day-to-day life. Indicators used to calculate scores are:
  - Road distance to GP surgery (2010)
  - Road distance to a food shop, ie a general store or a supermarket (2008)
  - Road distance to a primary school (2010)
  - Road distance to a Post Office (2008)

Traditionally, measures of deprivation have tended to be biased towards urban areas in the sense that these areas are more likely to be depicted as more deprived than rural areas. This is however not the case with the Geographical barriers sub-domain – access to services is a more pertinent issue to rural areas such as Shropshire County and is therefore particularly relevant in this case.

### SHROPSHIRE COUNTY

### **Barriers to Housing and Services Overall**

In 2010, 34.4% of the County's population lived in the fifth most deprived areas of England in terms of barriers to housing and services. In 2004, 33% of Shropshire's population lived in the most deprived fifth and in 2007 this proportion was 39.3%.

In 2010, 17.5% lived in the least deprived fifth of areas nationally (

### Table 26).






Figure 52 Barriers to Housing and Services in Shropshire Country by National Quintile in 2004, 2007 and 2010

The largest increase was seen in second most deprived fifth, with 10.5% in 2004 to 20% in 2007. There was a drop in the number of people in the least deprived fifth, from 25.1% in 2004 to just 7.8% in 2007. The story between 2007 and 2010 is quite different. The proportion of people in the 3 most deprived fifths nationally have dropped, although they have not yet returned to 2004 levels, the largest drop was seen in the most deprived fifth, there were 39.3% of Shropshire's population in this category in 2007 and by 2010 this proportion was down 4.9% to 34.4%. There has been a noticeable increase in the proportion falling in the 2 least deprived fifths. The greatest increase was in the least deprived fifth with 7.8% in 2007 increasing to 17.5% in 2010. These trends are shown Figure 52.

#### Wider Barriers

In 2010, 3.0% of the county's population lived in the most deprived fifth of areas nationally and 19.5% of Shropshire lived in the least deprived fifth. Quintile 4, the second least deprived nationally was the most populated quintile (34.6%).





Figure 54 Barriers to Housing and Services in Shropshire County: Wider Barriers Sub-domain by National Quintile in 2004, 2007 and 2010

Between 2004 and 2007 there was a shift towards increasing deprivation of wider barriers to housing and services. This was seen most noticeably, with a drop in the least deprived quintile from 60.9% down to just 4.2%. Between 2007 and 2010 there appears to be a shift away from more deprived quintiles. There is a drop in the proportions of people falling in quintiles 2 and 3. There was an increase of 13.6% in quintile 4 to 34.6% in 2010 and an increase of 15.3% from 4.2% in 2007 to 19.5% in 2010 for those falling in the least deprived quintile. These trends are displayed in Table 27 and in Figure 54.

### **Geographical Barriers**

In 2010, 43.8% of the county's population lived in areas which were among the most deprived fifth nationally in terms of geographical barriers to housing and services. In contrast to this, just 10.3% of the county's population lived in the least deprived fifth of areas nationally.





Figure 56 Barriers to Housing and Services in Shropshire County: Geographical Barriers Sub-domain by National Quintile in 2004, 2007 and 2010

Since 2004, Shropshire became slightly less deprived in this sub-domain. Between 2004 and 2007 there was a 2.6% drop within the most deprived quintile and a 3.2% drop in quintile 3, and a 4.5% increase in quintile 4 as well as a 1% increase in quintile 2. A similar trend towards becoming slightly less deprived was seen between 2007 and 2010 where there were further drops in the proportions in quintiles 1 through 4. There was an increase of 4% between 2007 and 2010 seen in the least deprived quintile (quintile 5). These trends are illustrated in Figure 56.


### **Barriers to Housing and Services Overall**

In 2010, **South Shropshire** had the largest proportion (44.3%) of inhabitants living in within the most deprived fifth of areas in England. **Oswestry** had the lowest proportion (28%).

**Bridgnorth** had the highest proportion of inhabitants living in the least deprived fifth of areas in England and **Shrewsbury and Atcham** had the lowest at 5.9%.


Between 2004 and 2007 **North Shropshire** became more deprived with marked increases in quintiles 1, 2, 3 and 4, and a drop of 33% in the least deprived quintile. From 2007 to 2010 this trend reversed somewhat, with noticeable decreases in the more deprived quintiles and increases in the least deprived quintiles. The proportion of inhabitants in the most deprived quintile fell by 15% from 56.6% to 41.4%, the proportion in quintile 3 fell by from 14.9% down to 2.9%. Figure 57 Barriers to Housing and Services in North Shropshire by National Quintile in 2004, 2007 and 2010





Figure 58 Barriers to Housing and Services in Oswestry by National Quintile in 2004, 2007 and 2010





Between 2004 and 2007, **Bridgnorth** District became more deprived, experiencing a drop of 11.1% in the least deprived quintile, and increases in the proportions of inhabitants falling in the three most deprived quintiles (1, 2 and 3). Figure shows that the story between 2007 and 2010 is slightly different. **Bridgnorth** appears to have become less deprived with small decreases in the 4 most deprived quintiles, and a large increase of 20.4% in the least deprived quintile. As with **South Shropshire**, the largest proportions of inhabitants lived in areas which fell in the most deprived fifth nationally. This has been the case since 2004 (Figure 61).

Figure 61 Barriers to Housing and Services in Bridgnorth by National Quintile in 2004, 2007 and 2010





#### Wider Barriers

In 2010, **Shrewsbury and Atcham** was the only district in Shropshire with inhabitants in the most deprived quintile (9.0%). Only two of the five districts had inhabitants in the least deprived quintile. Just over one third (33.7%) of **North Shropshire's** population and just under three quarters (72.2%) of **Bridgnorth's** population lived in areas which fell in the least deprived quintile nationally (Table 31).


In **North Shropshire** district, between 2004 and 2007, there was a shift towards increased deprivation. In 2004, 94.7% of the district's population lived in areas in the least deprived quintile and 5.3% lived in areas in the second least deprived quintile. By 2007, none of the district's population were living in areas in the least deprived quintile, the population was now distributed between the 4 most deprived quintiles with the two largest proportions falling in quintiles 2 and 3 (45.8% and 44.0% respectively). 
Figure 63 Barriers to Housing and Services in Oswestry; Wider Barriers Subdomain by National Quintile in 2004, 2007 and 2010


Figure 64 Barriers to Housing and Services in Shrewsbury and Atcham; Wider Barriers Sub-domain by National Quintile in 2004, 2007 and 2010

Figure 66 Barriers to Housing and Services in Bridgnorth; Wider Barriers Subdomain by National Quintile in 2004, 2007 and 2010




#### **Geographical Barriers**

In 2010, **South Shropshire** district had the highest proportion of inhabitants living in areas within the most deprived quintile (61.8%). This is followed closely by **North Shropshire** with 58.7%. **Shrewsbury and Atcham** district had the lowest with 30.6%.

**Shrewsbury and Atcham** district had the highest proportion in the least deprived quintile with 14.5% and this was followed closely by **Oswestry** district with 13.9% (Table 31).


Figure 67 Barriers to Housing and Services in North Shropshire; Geographical Barriers Sub-domain by National Quintile in 2004, 2007 and 2010

There has been very little change in the levels of deprivation in terms of geographical barriers to housing and services in **North Shropshire** since 2004. Between 2007 and 2010 there were slight increases in quintiles 3 and 5 both by 2.5% and a decrease of 4.7% in quintile 4. These trends are shown in Figure 67.


Between 2004 and 2007, **Oswestry** district experienced increases in quintiles 2 and decreases in quintiles 1, 3 and 4 with quintile 5 remaining the same. Figure 68 Barriers to Housing and Services in Oswestry; Geographical Barriers Sub-domain by National Quintile in 2004, 2007 and 2010






Since 2004, **South Shropshire** district has remained largely unchanged in terms of levels of deprivation. Between 2004 and 2007 there was a drop in the most deprived quintile and an increase in the second most deprived quintile. There was also a very slight increase in the least deprived quintile. #### SHROPSHIRE SOAs

#### **Barriers to Housing and Services Overall**

In 2010, there were 66 SOAs which fell into most deprived fifth in England. In 2004 there were 63 SOAs and in 2007 there were 77. In 2010 there were 17 SOA with a ranking of national percentile ranking of 1% or less. This has remained unchanged since 2007. In 2004 there were only 5 SOAs with a national percentile ranking of 1% or less. SOAs located in **Lawley, Bitterley with Stoke St. Milborough** and **Corve Valley** were the most deprived in the county and have been since 2004. (The three most deprived SOAs are shown in Figure 51.)

In 2010, there were 35 SOAs in the least deprived quintile nationally (Table 32). In 2004 there were 50, this dropped to 15 in 2007. An SOA in the ward of **Highley** in **Bridgnorth** was the least deprived in Shropshire with a national percentile ranking of 100% (up from 88% in 2004 and 85% in 2007).

An SOA in **Weston Rhyn** in **Oswestry** demonstrated the greatest decline in terms of deprivation, its national percentile ranking dropped by 57% from 85% in 2004 to 42% in 2010. However, this SOA improved since 2007 when its national percentile ranking was just 28%.

In contrast to this, an SOA in **Alveley** in **Bridgnorth** has shown the greatest improvement in terms of barriers to housing and services. Since 2004 its national percentile ranking increased by 24% from 64% to 95% in 2010 (this represents a jump from quintile 4 to quintile 5).



#### **Wider Barriers**

In 2010, 5 SOAs fell in the most deprived quintile nationally. This number increased since 2004, when there were no SOAs in this quintile, and in 2007 when there were only 4. These 5 SOAs are located in **Underdale**, **Harlescott**, **Castlefields and Quarry**, and **Bowbrook** all within the **Shrewsbury and Atcham** district. (The three most deprived SOAs are shown in Figure 53.) The number of SOAs which fell into the least deprived quintile nationally dropped from 120 in 2004 to just 8 in 2007. This number had since increased to 38 in 2010.

The SOA with the least deprived national ranking was **Bridgnorth Castle** in the district of **Bridgnorth** with a ranking of 97%. This has remained the least deprived SOA in Shropshire since 2007. In 2004, an SOA in **Whixhall** in **North Shropshire** was the least deprived in the County and had a national ranking of 99%.

The greatest decline in terms of deprivation since 2004 was seen in an SOA in **Gobowen** in **Oswestry**. This SOA dropped from a national percentile ranking of 79% in 2004 to a ranking of 44% in 2010. In 2007 it had a national ranking of 33%. This SOA fell from 4<sup>th</sup> quintile to the 2<sup>nd</sup> quintile in 2007 and then moved up to the 3<sup>rd</sup> quintile in 2010.

Every SOA in Shropshire has experienced a decline in their national percentile rankings since 2004. The smallest decline in terms of deprivation since 2004 was seen in an SOA in **Bridgnorth Castle** in **Bridgnorth**. Compared to 2004 rankings this SOA has only dropped its national percentile rankings by 1% from 98% to 97%. However in 2007 this SOA had a national percentile ranking of 89% (this SOA remained in the least deprived national quintile).



#### **Geographical Barriers**

In 2010, 85 of the 192 SOAs in Shropshire were in the most deprived fifth of areas within England. This number has fallen since 2004 when there were 94 and since in 2007 when there were 90. 11 SOAs in the most deprived quintile had a national percentile ranking score below 1%. The bottom five of these were located in Corve Valley, Bitterley with Stoke St. Milborough, and Upper Corvedale in South Shropshire and Lawley in Shrewsbury and Atcham. (The three most deprived SOAs are shown in Figure 55.) There were 20 SOAs in the least deprived quintile; this increased from 12 in 2004 and 13 in 2007. An SOA in Castle in Oswestry was the least deprived in the county with a national percentile ranking of 96% (quintile 5), up from 88% in 2004.

The greatest decline in terms of deprivation levels was seen in an SOA in **Bridgnorth East** with a drop in percentile rankings of 23%, from 76% down to 53% in 2010. In 2007 this SOA had a national percentile ranking of just 50%. This represents a drop from quintile 4 to quintile 3.

An SOA in **Highley** in **Bridgnorth** showed the greatest improvement in deprivation, it increased its national ranking from 47% in 2004 to 54% in 2007 and then to 92% in 2010 (quintile 3 to 5).



## **Crime and Disorder Deprivation**

#### SUMMARY

- In 2010, 1.4% of Shropshire's population lived in the most deprived fifth of areas in England. In contrast, 40.7% of the county's population lived within the least deprived fifth
- Levels of crime in the county are relatively low in Shropshire. The most deprived areas fall mostly within the urban areas of the County
- The most deprived SOAs were in located in Market Drayton East in North Shropshire, Castle in Oswestry and Bridgnorth East in Bridgnorth

The purpose of this domain is to measure the rate of recorded crime for four major volume crime types – burglary, theft, criminal damage and violence – representing the risk of personal and material victimisation at a small area level.

The indicators used to measure this aspect of deprivation are:

- Burglary (4 recorded crime types)
- Theft (5 recorded crime types)
- Criminal damage (11 recorded crime types)
- Violence (19 recorded crime types)

#### SHROPSHIRE COUNTY





Figure 76 Crime and Disorder Deprivation in Shropshire Country by National Quintile in 2004, 2007and 2010

In 2010, less than two percent (1.4%) of Shropshire's population lived in the most deprived fifth of areas in England. In contrast, 40.7% of the county's population lived within the least deprived fifth of areas in the nation (Table 34). Since 2004, there was a slight drop in the proportion of inhabitants in areas falling in the most deprived quintile (3.1%). There have been increases quintiles 2, 3, and 4, and a drop of 4.2% in those living in the least deprived quintile (Figure 76).


#### SHROPSHIRE DISTRICTS

In 2010, 3.2% of inhabitants in **Oswestry** district lived in areas which fell within the most deprived fifth of areas in England. This was followed closely by **Bridgnorth** with 3.1%. None of **Shrewsbury and Atcham's**, or **South Shropshire's** inhabitants lived in areas in the most deprived quintile nationally.

**South Shropshire** had the largest proportion of its population living in the least deprived fifth of areas nationally (Table 35).


Between 2004 and 2007, **North Shropshire** district experienced slight decreases in quintile 1 and 4 and a large decrease of 7.8% in quintile 4. There were increases of 3.9% and 8.2% in quintiles 3 and 5 respectively. Between 2007 and 2010, quintiles 1 and 4 have returned to 2004 levels, quintile 2 increased by 3.1% but is still below its 2004 level. Quintile 3 dropped by 8.9% to below 2004 level. Figure 77 Crime and Disorder Deprivation in North Shropshire by National Quintile in 2004, 2007 and 2010





Figure 78 Crime and Disorder Deprivation in Oswestry by National Quintile in 2004, 2007 and 2010




Between 2004 and 2007, **Shrewsbury and Atcham** experienced a slight shift towards increased deprivation, with slight decreases in quintiles 4 and 5 and slight increases in proportion of inhabitants living in areas falling within more deprived quintiles, 1, 2, and 3. Figure 81 Crime and Disorder Deprivation in Bridgnorth by National Quintile in 2004, 2007 and 2010



#### SHROPSHIRE SOAs

Levels of crime are relatively low in the county of Shropshire, and as would be expected, the areas with higher levels of deprivation in terms of crime and disorder fall within the more urban areas of the county.

In 2010, a total of 3 SOAs fell within the most deprived quintile nationally. This number is down from 8 in 2004 and from 5 in 2007. The three most deprived SOAs were in located in **Market Drayton East** in **North Shropshire**, **Castle** in **Oswestry** and **Bridgnorth East** in **Bridgnorth** (Figure 75).

The number of SOAs falling in the least deprived quintile nationally has fallen below 2004 levels. In 2004 there were 87 SOAs, this rose to 94 in 2007, and in 2010 there were 79 SOAs in the least deprived quintile (Table 36). The two least deprived SOAs were located in **Kemp Valley** in **South Shropshire** and in **Market Drayton North** in **North Shropshire**, both with a national percentile ranking of 100%.

The greatest decline in deprivation in terms of crime and disorder was seen in **Highley** in **Bridgnorth**. This SOAs national percentile ranking dropped from 81% in 2004 down to 25% in 2010. This represents a drop from the 5<sup>th</sup> quintile down to the 2<sup>nd</sup> quintile.

The greatest improvement in terms of crime and disorder was seen in **Belle Vue** in **Shrewsbury and Atcham**. This SOA's national percentile ranking increased from 23% in 2004 to 70% in 2010, representing a jump from quintile 2 to quintile 5.



## **Living Environment Deprivation**

#### **SUMMARY**

- Living Environment Deprivation Overall
  - In 2010, 9.1% of Shropshire's population lived in areas which were the most deprived fifth nationally. Just over a quarter (25.2%) of the county's population lived in areas which were situated in the least deprived fifth nationally.
  - In 2010, 10.1% of inhabitants in North Shropshire and 10% of inhabitants in Oswestry lived in areas which were in the most deprived in the country.
  - In 2010 the most deprived SOAs were located in Bitterley with Stoke St Milborough and Corve Valley in South Shropshire, and Gatacre in Oswestry.
- Indoor Living Environment Deprivation
  - In 2010, just over one fifth (22%) of the county's population lived in areas that were the most deprived fifth of areas nationally.
     13.5% of Shropshire's population lived in areas which were the least deprived fifth nationally.
  - In 2010, Shrewsbury and Atcham had the least inhabitants in the most deprived quintile nationally (8.3%). In South Shropshire, 41.9% of the inhabitants lived in areas which were considered to be among the fifth most deprived of areas in England.
  - The three most deprived SOAs in the county were located in Bitterley with Stoke St. Milborough, Corve Valley and Kemp Valley in South Shropshire. All three of these SOAs were ranked in the bottom 5% of SOAs in England.
- Outdoor Living Environment Deprivation
  - In 2010, none of the county's population lived in areas which fell in the most deprived fifth nationally in terms of the outdoor living environment. Only 4.9% of Shropshire's population fell in the second most deprived fifth nationally. Nearly two thirds (64.3%) of the county's population lived in areas which were among the fifth least deprived areas in the country.
  - In 2010, there were no inhabitants in any of the districts living in areas in most deprived fifth of area nationally. The district with the largest proportion of its inhabitants living in areas in the second most deprived quintile nationally was **Shrewsbury and Atcham** with 8.7%
  - The two most deprived SOAs in the county were located in Sundorne and Battlefield and Heathgates in Shrewsbury and Atcham.

# This domain measures deprivation relating to characteristics of the living environment.

It includes two sub-domains:

- **The Indoor Living Environment** this measures quality of housing. The scores are derived from the following indicators:
  - Social and private housing in poor condition (2005)
  - Houses without central heating (2001)
- The Outdoor Living Environment this contains measures about air quality and road traffic accidents. Indicators used to calculate scores include:
  - o Air quality (2008)
  - Road traffic accidents involving injury to pedestrians and cyclists (2007-2009)

#### SHROPSHIRE COUNTY

#### **Living Environment Deprivation Overall**

In 2010, 9.1% of Shropshire's population lived in areas which were the most deprived fifth nationally in terms of their overall living environment. Just over a quarter (25.2%) of the county's population lived in areas which were situated in the least deprived fifth nationally (Table 37).





Figure 84 Living Environment Deprivation in Shropshire Country by National Quintile in 2004, 2007 and 2010

Since 2004 there have been increases in the proportion of Shropshire's population falling in the most deprived and the least deprived quintiles. In quintile 1, the most deprived quintile, the proportion doubled from 4.2% to 8.4% between 2004 and 2007. From 2007 to 2010 the increase was less noticeable, from 8.45 to 9.1%. This proportion still remains under 10%. In the least deprived quintile, there was an increase of 5.1% between 2004 and 2007, and between 2007 and 2010 there was a further increase of 1.1% to 25.2% of the population. These trends are shown in Figure 84.

### **Indoor Living Environment Deprivation**

In 2010, just over one fifth (22%) of the county's population lived in areas that were the in most deprived quintile nationally in terms of the indoor living environment. 13.5% of Shropshire's population lived in areas which were the least deprived quintile nationally (Table 38).





Figure 86 Living Environment Deprivation in Shropshire Country: The Indoor Living Environment Subdomain by National Quintile in 2004, 2007 and 2010



#### **Outdoor Living Environment Deprivation**

In 2010, none of the county's population lived in areas which fell in the most deprived fifth nationally in terms of the outdoor living environment. Only 4.9% of Shropshire's population fell in the second most deprived fifth nationally. Nearly two thirds (64.3%) of the county's population lived in areas which were among the fifth least deprived areas in the country (Table 39).

The county's population distribution by national quintile has, for the most part remained unchanged since 2004. With the largest proportion of the population falling in the least deprived quintile and the smallest proportion of the population falling in the most deprived quintile.





Figure 88 Living Environment Deprivation in Shropshire County: The Outdoor Living Environment Subdomain by National Quintile in 2004, 2007 and 2010

There have been some slight changes in the proportions within each quintile, between 2004 and 2010, quintiles 2 and 4 have shown slight increases of 2.8% and 7.2% respectively. Quintiles 3 and 5 have shown declines of 6.1% and 4% respectively (Figure 88).




In 2010, 10.1% of inhabitants in **North Shropshire** and 10% of inhabitants in **Oswestry** lived in areas which were in the most deprived in the country in terms of their overall living environment. None of **Shrewsbury and Atcham's** population lived in areas in the most deprived quintile nationally. **Shrewsbury and Atcham** had the largest proportion of its population (39.4%) living in areas within the least deprived quintile nationally (Table 40). Between 2004 and 2007, **North Shropshire** experienced a 5% increase in the most deprived quintile. A decrease of about 15% was seen in quintile 3. Very slight increases were seen in quintiles 2, 4 and 5. Between 2007 and 2010 there was little or no change in both the most deprived and least deprived quintiles. Drops of less than 5% were seen in both quintile 2 and quintile 3. Quintile 4, the second least deprived quintile increased from 13% to 18.6% during this time period (Figure 89).

Figure 89 Living Environment Deprivation in North Shropshire by National Quintile in 2004, 2007 and 2010




Between 2004 and 2007, **Oswestry** experienced increases in quintiles 1 and 3, and decreases in quintiles 4 and 5. Quintile 2 (the second most deprived quintile) remained unchanged. Between 2007 and 2010 there was no change in the most deprived quintile (quintile 1). The two most noticeable trends can be seen in the middle two quintiles, since 2004, there has been a steady increase in the proportion of the district's inhabitants falling in quintile 3. Between 2004 and 2007, **Shrewsbury and Atcham** experienced an increase in quintiles 2 and 5, and a decrease in quintiles 1, 3 and 4. The largest increase was seen in the least deprived quintile, from 28% to 40%. The largest decrease occurred in quintile 3, dropping from 29% to 17%. Between 2007 and 2010, there were no inhabitants in the most deprived quintile; small increases of 1.8% and 1.6% were seen in quintile 2 and quintile 4. A small decrease of 3% occurred in quintile 3. 
Figure 91 Living Environment Deprivation in Shrewsbury and Atcham by National Quintile in 2004, 2007 and 2010



Between 2004 and 2007, **South Shropshire** district experienced an increase in deprivation in terms of the living environment. The proportion of inhabitants falling in the most deprived quintile increased from 8.9% to 19.8%. A subsequent decrease was seen in the second most deprived quintile, a drop from 35.2% to 22.2%. A similar pattern was seen in the top three quintiles. An increase of 10% was seen in quintile 3 and subsequent decreases of 2% and 6% were seen in quintiles 4 and 5 respectively.

Between 2007 and 2010, the proportion in the most deprived quintile remained the same, an increase of 5% occurred in quintile 2. Quintiles 3 and 4 both experienced decreases of 5.1% and 8.5% respectively. A subsequent increase of 8.7% was seen in the least deprived quintile, quintile 5. These trends can be seen in (Figure 92).

Since 2004, the proportion of **Bridgnorth** inhabitants falling in the most deprived quintile has increased dramatically. This proportion has risen from 2.8% to 35.2% in 2010. There has been a steady decrease in the proportion of inhabitants in the second most deprived quintile. The proportion fell by 25%, from just under half of the districts inhabitants in 2004 (49.6%) to just under a quarter in 2010 (24.7%). There was little change Quintile 3 between 2004 and 2007 and only a decrease of 3.5% between 2007 and 2010. In 2007 the proportion in quintile 4 dropped by 7.1% to 11% but then increased back up to 20.7% in 2010. Figure 93 Living Environment Deprivation in Bridgnorth by National Quintile in 2004, 2007 and 2010





## **Indoor Living Environment Deprivation**

In 2010, of all the other districts, **Shrewsbury and Atcham** had the least inhabitants in the most deprived quintile nationally (8.3%). 
Figure 94 Living Environment Deprivation in North Shropshire: The Indoor Living Environment Subdomain by National Quintile in 2004, 2007 and 2010



Figure 95 Living Environment Deprivation in Oswestry: The Indoor Living Environment Subdomain by National Quintile in 2004, 2007and 2010









#### **Outdoor Living Environment Deprivation**


Figure 99 Living Environment Deprivation in North Shropshire: Outdoors Living Environment Subdomain by National Quintile in 2004, 2007 and 2010

In 2010, there were no inhabitants in any of the districts living in areas which fell in most deprived fifth of areas nationally in terms of their outdoors living environment. The district with the largest proportion of its inhabitants living in areas in the second most deprived quintile nationally was **Shrewsbury and Athcam** with 8.7%. This was followed closely by **Oswestry** with 7% and **Bridgnorth** with 5.9%. **South Shropshire** had the largest proportion of its population living in the least deprived fifth of areas nationally with 86.1%; this was followed closely by **North Shropshire** with 77.5% (Table 42). In **North Shropshire**, between 2004 and 2010, there was very little change to levels of deprivation in terms of the outdoor living environment. The largest proportion of this district's inhabitants lived in areas which have consistently fallen in the least deprived fifth nationally. The rest of this district's inhabitants live in areas within the second least deprived fifth nationally (Figure 99).



Figure 100 Living Environment Deprivation in Oswestry: The Outdoor Living Environment Subdomain by National Quintile in 2004, 2007 and 2010







## SHROPSHIRE SOAs

## **Living Environment Deprivation Overall**

In 2010, there were 18 SOAs in Shropshire among the most deprived quintile nationally. This number had increased from 9 SOAs in 2004 to 17 SOAs in 2007. In 2010 the most deprived SOAs were located in **Bitterley with Stoke St Milborough** and **Corve Valley** in **South Shropshire**, and **Gatacre** in **Oswestry** (Figure 83).

The number of SOAs falling in the least deprived quintile nationally had risen since 2004. In 2004 there were 36 SOAs, this rose to 46 in 2007, and then to 48 in 2010. The least deprived SOA in the county in 2010 was located in **Bowbrook** in **Shrewsbury and Atcham**. This SOA had a national percentile ranking of 100%, falling in the least deprived quintile.

Between 2004 and 2010, the greatest decline in terms of deprivation of the outdoor living environment was also seen in an SOA in **Bowbrook** in **Shrewsbury and Atcham**. This particular SOA's national percentile ranking dropped from 71% in 2004 to 31% in 2010. This represents a drop from the fourth down to the second quintile.

The greatest improvement in deprivation of the overall living environment was seen in an SOA in **Meole Brace** in **Shrewsbury and Atcham**. This SOA's national percentile ranking has increased from 53% in 2004 to 81% in 2007 and remained at 81% in 2010. This represents a jump from quintile 3 to quintile 5.



#### **Indoor Living Environment Deprivation**

In 2010, a total of 42 SOAs fell within the most deprived quintile nationally in terms of their indoor living environment. This number is has dropped from 43 in both 2004 and 2007. The three most deprived SOAs in the county were located in **Bitterley with Stoke St. Milborough**, **Corve Valley** and **Kemp Valley** in **South Shropshire**. All three of these SOAs were ranked in the bottom 5% of SOAs in England (Figure 85).

The number of SOAs falling in the least deprived quintile nationally rose from 23 in 2004 to 26 in both 2007 and 2010. The three least deprived SOAs were located in **Sutton and Reabrook**, **Battlefield and Heathgates** and **Bowbrook** all in **Shrewsbury and Atcham**. They had national percentile rankings of 97%, 98% and 99% respectively.

The greatest decline in terms of indoor living environment deprivation was seen in an SOA in **Bowbrook** in **Shrewsbury and Atcham**. This SOAs national percentile ranking dropped from 54% in 2004 to 21% in 2010. This represents a drop from the third quintile to the second quintile.



## **Outdoor Living Environment Deprivation**

In 2010, not one of the county's SOAs fell within the most deprived quintile nationally. This was the same in 2004. In 2007 only one SOA was in the most deprived fifth nationally. The two most deprived SOAs in the county were located in **Sundorne** and **Battlefield and Heathgates** in **Shrewsbury and Atcham**. Their national percentile rankings were 20% and 22% respectively. (The three most deprived SOAs are shown in Figure 87.)

The number of SOAs falling in the least deprived quintile dropped from 132 in 2004 down to 130 in 2007 then down to 124 in 2010. In 2010 there were 11 SOAs which had a national percentile ranking on 100%. These were:

Gobowen and Sweeney and Trefonen in Oswestry; Stottesdon in Bridgnorth; Bishop's Castle with Onny Valley, Church Stretton South and Worthen in South Shropshire; Condover, Harlescott, Battlefield and Heathgates, and Meole Brace in Shrewsbury and Atcham; and Market Drayton East in North Shropshire.

The greatest decline in terms of the outdoor living environment deprivation was seen in an SOA in **Gatacre** in **Oswestry**. This SOAs national percentile ranking has dropped from 93% in 2004 to 27% in 2010. This represents a drop from the fifth quintile to the second quintile.



The Index of Multiple Deprivation for 2010 is summarised at County level using 6 different measures. This allows deprivation levels in Shropshire to be compared with other Counties in England (Table 46).

These measures focus on different aspects of Multiple Deprivation and no single summary measure is favoured over any other.

#### **Table 46 Definition of Summary Measures**

The **Average Scores** and **Average Ranks** measures are two ways of depicting the average level of deprivation across the entire County. These are the population-weighted averages of the combined scores and ranks for the SOAs in a County.

The **Local Concentration** measure shows the severity of multiple deprivation in each County by measuring 'hot spots' of deprivation. It is the population-weighted average of the ranks of the County's most deprived LSOAs that contain exactly 10% of the County's population.

The **Extent** measure is the proportion of a County's population living in the most deprived SOAs in England.

**Income Scale** is the number of people who are income deprived.

**Employment Scale** is the number of people who are employment deprived.

## SHROPSHIRE COUNTY

## **Average Score**

Overall, Shropshire is a relatively affluent county. Since 2007 it has become less deprived. When looking at average scores, in 2004, Shropshire ranked as the 111<sup>th</sup> most deprived County out of 149 in England, In 2007, Shropshire ranked 106<sup>th</sup>. In 2010, Shropshire ranked as the 113<sup>th</sup> most deprived county out of 149 in England

## Average Rank

In terms of average rank, Shropshire ranks 101<sup>st</sup> out of 149. In 2004, it ranked 105<sup>th</sup> and in 2007 it ranked 101<sup>st</sup>. This ranking has remained unchanged since 2007.

#### **Extent**

In 2010, 4% of Shropshire County's population lived in the most deprived SOAs in England. This figure is up from 2% in 2004 and 3% in 2007. It is ranked 131<sup>st</sup> out of 149, down five places from 135 in 2007.

#### **Local Concentration**

Shropshire ranks 130<sup>th</sup> out of 149 for this measure –In 2004 the county's rank was 132<sup>nd</sup> and in 2007 it was 133<sup>rd</sup>.

#### Income Scale

In 2010, Shropshire ranked 107th out of 149. In both 2004 and 2007 the county was  $109^{th}$ .

#### **Employment Scale**

Shropshire's rank in 2010 was 99<sup>th</sup> out of 149. In 2007 it was 101<sup>st</sup> and in 2004 it was 96<sup>th</sup>.
