

**NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION & COMING INTO OPERATION
OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER AND DEFINITIVE MAP
AND STATEMENT MODIFICATION ORDER
HIGHWAYS ACT 1980
WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981**

**THE SHROPSHIRE COUNCIL (FOOTPATH 38 (PART) PARISH OF EATON-
UNDER-HEYWOOD)
PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER 2025**

On 17th April 2026, The Shropshire Council (the "Council") confirmed the above-named Order made under section 119 of the Highways Act 1980 and section 53A(2) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981. The effect of the Order as confirmed is to;

divert the full width of Eaton-under-Heywood FP38 (part) commencing from SO 4719 8783, Point A on the Order Map, and then running in a general NNW direction to SO 4713 8793, continuing in a general NW direction to SO 4710 8798, continuing in a general NNW direction to SO 4687 8837, continuing in a general north direction to SO 4680 8872, continuing in a general NW direction to meet the continuation of FP38 at SO 4666 8882, Point B on the Order Map, approximately 1180 metres **onto a line** commencing from the remainder of FP38 at SO 4719 8783, Point A on the Order Map, and then running in a general NNE direction to where it meets the County Road at SO 4725 8804, continuing from the opposite side of the County Road at SO 4725 8806 in a general NNE direction to SO 4726 8811, continuing in a general NW direction to SO 4689 8839, continuing in a general NNW direction to re-join the continuation of FP38 at SO 4666 8882, Point B on the Order Map, approximately 1230 metres with a width of 2 metres throughout.

Shropshire Council certify that the Order became operative on 14th July 2025; but if a person aggrieved by the Order wants to question its validity, or that of any provision contained in it, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980, as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or any regulation made under the Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order, he or she may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 6 to the Act, within 6 weeks from 17th April 2026 make an application to the High Court.
