Transition from Primary to Secondary School 2022

We are pleased to announce that the SIS-HI transition day for Yr6 and Yr7 pupils is able to go ahead in person this year. The event is booked for 8th June and all hearing device users in Yr6 and Yr7 will be invited to attend. It is a one day event where pupils in Yr6 can learn more about transition to secondary school and have the opportunity to meet and learn from Yr7 pupils who have already been through this transition.

Not only do all pupils have the opportunity to meet with other hearing aid wearers from across Shropshire, there will be a range of activities to engage with, from team building games to group challenges and of course time for the Yr6 pupils to ask their pressing questions to the Yr7 pupils. Yr7 pupils can enjoy sharing their experiences and reflecting on what their transition period has been like.

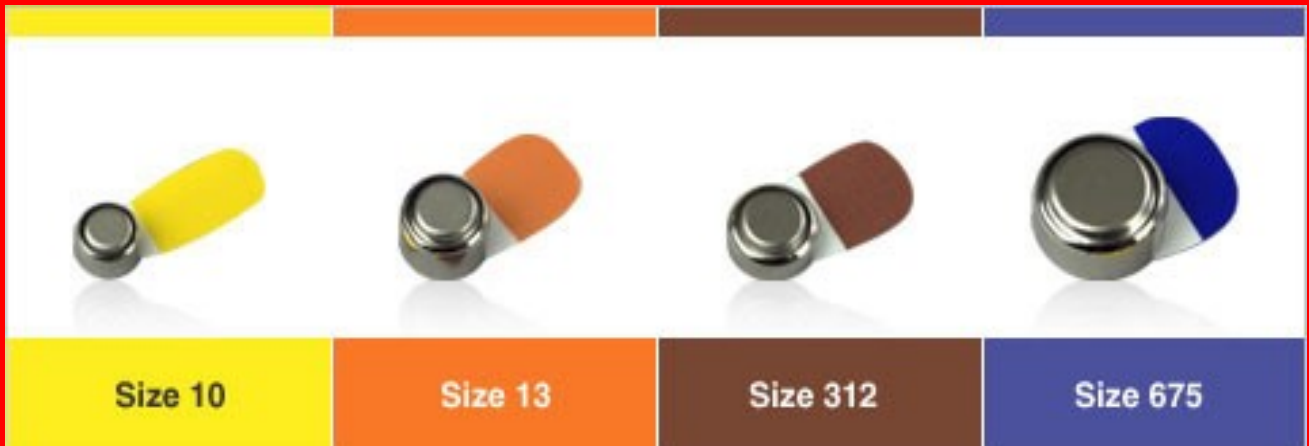
