

**PRIMARY/JUNIOR SCHOOL OFFERS SEPTEMBER 2026**  
**WHAT TO DO AFTER RECEIVING AN OFFER OF A SCHOOL PLACE**

Now that you have received your child's offer of a Primary/Junior school place, please see the options below to see what action might be required from you.

*You must inform the Admissions Team, without delay, if you have moved house or the address, we have for you is not correct.*

**IF YOUR APPLICATION WAS SUCCESSFUL FOR YOUR FIRST PREFERENCE**

If your child has been offered the 1<sup>st</sup> preference at a **Shropshire** local authority school, we assume that you will accept the offer of this place and there is nothing more you need to do now.

If your child has been offered 1st preference at a school that is in another local authority area then you need to confirm with the local authority for that school, or with the school itself, that you wish to accept the offer.

**IF YOUR APPLICATION WAS UNSUCCESSFUL**

For any **Shropshire** school named on your application that your child has not been offered a place, 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> or 4<sup>th</sup> preference, their details have automatically been added to the school's waiting list.

If a place becomes available at a school for which your child is eligible, we shall contact you to advise. Waiting lists are held in the school's oversubscription criteria. You will hold the current school place offered until an alternative can be made.

If you wish to accept the place offered and do not wish to be on a schools waiting list please email [school-admissions@shropshire.gov.uk](mailto:school-admissions@shropshire.gov.uk) to ask for your child's name to be removed from the school(s) waiting list.

If your preferred schools are **not** Shropshire local authority schools, please contact the appropriate authority for their information about waiting lists and appeals. If you have not received an offer of a place at your preferred school(s), this is because there have been more applications for places at the school than there are places available. To allocate places above the admission number would be prejudicial to efficient education and the efficient use of resources.

The places have all been offered to children with a higher priority under the admissions criteria, as described in the "Parents' Guide to Primary Education" booklet.

If there is an \* next to the school's name and a place has not been offered this is because of infant class size restrictions, this specifies that classes must not exceed 30 children in infant classes where there is only one teacher. ### **IF YOU DO NOT WANT THE SCHOOL OFFERED**

If you have changed your mind about your preferred school, or if you are moving house or making other arrangements for your child, e.g. going to private school or home education, you are required to inform the Admissions Team. Please email [school-admissions@shropshire.gov.uk](mailto:school-admissions@shropshire.gov.uk). Please include your child's full name, date of birth, address and current allocated school.

Other people waiting for a vacancy at the school you have been offered, may benefit if you release a place in these circumstances.

### **APPEAL AGAINST THE DECISION NOT TO OFFER YOUR CHILD A PLACE**

If your child has been refused a place at your preferred school, you have the right to appeal the decision to an independent panel. The appeal process is separate from the initial admissions process and the panel's decision is legally binding on both you and the school.

If you decide to appeal, the grounds for your appeal must be in writing and detail your reasons for wanting a place for your child at a particular school so that the independent panel can consider the strength of your case.

Where a child is refused a place on infant class size prejudice grounds, the panel can only offer a place to a child where it is satisfied that either:

*The admission of extra children wouldn't breach the infant class size limit; or*

*The admissions arrangements didn't follow admissions law or weren't correctly and impartially applied, and the child would have been offered a place if the arrangements had complied or had been correctly and impartially applied; or*

*The decision to refuse admission wasn't one which a reasonable admission authority would have made in the circumstances of the case.*

Ensure that your appeal is submitted by 15 May. You will be informed by Legal and Democratic Services of a hearing date and the procedures for your appeal. If you wish to provide any further information nearer to the date of your appeal, you will be able to do so. The appeals are held during June/July.

If you submit an appeal after 15 May 2026, it may not be possible to offer an appeal date before the end of the summer term. Appeals are usually held within 30 school days but are not scheduled in the school holidays.

Appeals will be heard by an independent appeal panel and under normal circumstances the hearing will be at the Guildhall in Shrewsbury during June/July. The Local Authority has the facility to hear an appeal remotely via video conference should an appellant require this due to illness.

The current school place offered is retained pending the outcome of the appeal. If unsuccessful at the appeal stage, your child's name will continue to be held on a waiting list.

### **FALSE ADDRESSES**

Parents and carers are reminded that offers are made on the basis of the information provided in their applications.

**If that information is inaccurate, or your address has changed since you submitted your application, you should inform the Admissions Team immediately. Places could be withdrawn where misleading or fraudulent information has been given.**

There is a telephone line available to report anonymously and confidentially any instance where you believe that an application for a school place has been made fraudulently. If you are aware of such an application, please call (01743) 254435. Outcomes of an investigation will not be disclosed.

### **TRANSPORT**

School transport will normally be provided where a pupil is attending the nearest or catchment area school for the home address, where the distance between home and school is 2 miles or over, as measured by the shortest pedestrian route. Income assessed transport assistance can also be considered. Further information can be found on the website [www.shropshire.gov.uk/school-transport/](http://www.shropshire.gov.uk/school-transport/). Applications can be made online using this link or over the phone with Customer Services by calling 0345 6789008. **Applications should be submitted by 31st May.**

Applications received after this date will still be considered but may not be processed until after the start of the Autumn term. In the interim, parents/carers will be responsible for making the necessary travel arrangements, access to school transport will not be permitted until eligibility has been confirmed.

### **FUTURE AVAILABILITY OF PLACES FOR YOUNGER SIBLINGS**

Parents/carers are advised that if your child has been successful as an "out of catchment area" applicant there is no guarantee whatsoever that a younger sibling can be offered the same school in future years, especially if their year group is oversubscribed.
