In challenging financial times, the pressures facing West Mercia Police have meant that some tough decisions have had to be made in terms of how the force operates. The budget for 2025/26 will ensure resources are focused on your priorities which are outlined in the PCC's West Mercia Safer Communities Plan:

Cutting crime

- Maintain a strong presence in town centres
- Reducing harm on our roads by retaining specialist roads policing officers

Supporting victims and witnesses

- Tackling violence against women and girls, and other high harm crimes, through vulnerability officers
- Developing a Victims' Hub to ensure victims get the support they need to cope and recover

Policing with the community

- Investing in the operational call centre to improve contact via 101 and 999
- Increasing the visibility and accessibility of police officers

Maximising resources and value for money

- Making best use of technology to deliver effective and efficient policing
- Reducing carbon emissions and maximising energy efficiency

What will you pay towards policing?

In 2025/26 the PCC will have £302m to spend on policing, community safety and victim services across West Mercia. Below shows how the money will be allocated, with the largest amount allocated to front line policing.

38%

on investigating crime and bringing offenders to justice

on the police estate, victim services and governance of the police (Office of the PCC)

on support to policing

on specialist policing teams
