

Silver-Studded Blue (Plebejus argus)



The Silver-studded Blue is a characteristic butterfly of English lowland heath. It is a nationally scarce species which has declined substantially through much of its former range, but which is still locally abundant on heathlands in southern England. Prees Heath Common is the only site remaining for this species in the Midlands area and therefore this site is of regional and national importance.

The Silver-studded Blue requires larval foodplants growing alongside patches of open soil or in short turf. It also needs the presence of one or two key species of ants with which it has a relationship at all stages of its life cycle.

1 Objectives and Targets

1.1 Objectives

- A.Protect and enhance the existing population of Silver-studded Blues at Prees Heath Common by acquiring at least part of the site as a nature reserve.
- B. Increase the amount of suitable habitat available to the Silver-studded Blue at Prees Heath Common as well as encouraging appropriate management on other nearby sites.
- C. Raise awareness of the status and needs of the Silver-studded Blue through communication and education.

1.2 Targets

- To double the available habitat for Silver-studded Blue at Prees Heath from 3 ha to 6 ha by 2015
- To achieve and maintain a medium population (between 400 and 4,000 individuals) of Silver-studded Blue at Prees Heath until 2015.
- To extend the population of Silver-studded Blue to 2 new sites within the local area by 2015.

2 Current Status

2.1 Importance

The Silver-studded Blue is widespread across temperate Europe and Asia to Japan. Its range appears to be stable in much of Europe but declines have been reported in some central and western European countries. In Britain, the Silver-studded Blue is a nationally scarce species which shows no evidence of recovery from its rapid decline in the twentieth century.

2.2 Trends

The national decline of the Silver-studded Blue was estimated to be 71% since 1800 (at the 10km square level) in 2001. Prees Heath Common is the only site for the Silver-studded Blue remaining in the West Midlands region.

2.3 Population and Distribution

The main centres of population for this species in Britain are the heaths of southern and south-west England, coastal Wales and parts of East Anglia. The population at Prees Heath Common is large despite only a small amount of habitat available at present.

3 Current Factors Affecting the Species

Nationally this species has suffered losses to:

- Continuing destruction of heathland
- Absence of suitable management
- Inappropriate heathland management
- Changes in rabbit populations
- Site isolation and heathland fragmentation
- Increased quarrying activities

4 Current Action

4.1 Policy and Protection

- The Silver-studded Blue is currently listed on Schedule 5 of the 1981 Wildlife and Countryside Act (for sale only).
- It is also listed under the following category:
 - UKBAP Priority Species (1998)
 - A species action plan for the Silver-studded Blue was published in 1996 by Butterfly Conservation.
- Prees Heath is partly SSSI and County Wildlife Site.

4.2 Management, Research and Survey

- Prees Heath Common and the Intervention Grain Store have been managed by agreements through EN.
- Numbers of Silver-studded Blues at Prees Heath Common and the Intervention Grain Store have been regularly monitored by a peak flight transect since 1991.

5 Key Habitat

• Open ground with bare soil or short vegetation within lowland heathland and colonised by ants.
