

Pre-course information for learners on Tier 2 Oliver McGowan Mandatory Training in Learning Disability and Autism (Oliver's Training)

Pre-reading and Learner Resources: The Tier 2 Oliver's training is structured into a morning and an afternoon session. The morning looks at Learning Disability and the afternoon looks at Autism. There is a [Pre-course Reading Document](#) which contains very important information about key legislation and standards which cannot be covered in depth on the course itself. **Delegates must read this booklet before attending the training.**

In addition, there is a [Tier 2 Learning Disability Delegate Handbook](#) to accompany the morning session and a [Tier 2 Autism Delegate Handbook](#) to accompany the afternoon session. These are useful reference guides and resources for reflection. You may wish to print them out in advance of the training and bring them with you. There are sections to make your own notes which you may find useful during the training. It is not essential to bring the delegate handbooks with you on the day, and we will not be able to provide copies.

eLearning: Delegates must complete the Oliver McGowan Training eLearning before attending the face-to-face session. This can be accessed in a number of ways. Your organisation may host it on their own learning system, alternatively it can be accessed via:
