

## Questions to ask a potential childcare provider.

Choosing the right childcare provider is a crucial decision for any parent. It's important to ask comprehensive questions to ensure your child will be in a safe, nurturing, and stimulating environment. Here are some questions to consider when evaluating potential childcare providers for your child:

## <u>Initial questions when looking at potential settings:</u>

- 1. Are you open all year or just term time?
- 2. What days and hours are you open?
- 3. What is the hourly/daily/session cost?
- 4. Is there any additional charge for meals, drinks, snacks or outings?
- 5. Do you offer any of the free funding? Including 15 to 30 hours for 9 months to 4-year-olds, 24U?
- 6. Do you have any vacancies (for the dates and times you want)?
- 7. Is there a waiting list?
- 8. Do I have to pay a deposit or a retainer?
- 9. Is there a charge if my child is poorly or on holiday?
- 10. Is there a charge if I am late picking my child up?
- 11. What is the child-to-staff ratio and group size?
- 12. Do all staff and volunteers have DBS checks?
- 13. What schools/nurseries do you drop off/pick up from?
- 14. How do you communicate with parents? How will you keep me informed about my child?
- 15. Do you administer medication?
- 16. Are the doors secured? How do parents and visitors gain access?
- 17. How does the setting care for and support children with a disability or additional need?
- 18. How does the setting support children with food intolerances and allergies
- 19. Do you offer settling in sessions? how many and for how long?

## Questions to ask when you visit settings:

- 1. What is your daily routine and curriculum? What does a typical day involve?
- 2. What activities do you do with the children?
- 3. Do children have access to an outdoor area?
- 4. Where do children rest or sleep?
- 5. Will my child have a key person, and how many other children will they have?
- 6. How do you support children's learning and development?
- 7. What festivals or special occasions do you celebrate and how?
- 8. What qualifications do staff have? Do they have ongoing training?
- 9. Are staff trained in First Aid?
- 10. What supplies should I provide for my child?
- 11. What is your child protection procedure?

- 12. What is your discipline and behaviour management policy?
- 13. What is your potty training policy?
- 14. What protocol do you follow if a child is sick?
- 15. What happens in an emergency?

When visiting a new setting, there are some key observations you can take note of to see if the setting is a good fit for your family:

- 1. Is there a variety of good quality, safe and clean toys and equipment?
- 2. Are children playing together? Do they look like they're having fun?
- 3. Are staff friendly and welcoming to you and your child?
- 4. Are staff interacting with the children in their care?
- 5. Do the children seem happy, safe and well cared for?

## Additionally:

- 1. Ask to see a copy of the contract before you sign it.
- 2. Ask to see a copy of their insurance certificate.
- 3. A copy of the settings latest Ofsted Inspection report can be found via <u>Find an Ofsted</u> inspection report
- 4. If the setting provides meals and snacks ask to see a copy of the menu.

By asking these questions, you can gain a deeper understanding of the childcare provider's practices and ensure they are a good fit for your family's needs. Remember to also trust your instincts and observe the environment during your visit to make an informed decision.

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
