Kinship Carers are family or close family friends who step up, often during an unexpected crisis, to care for a child (one or more) when their parents aren't able to. This may be because the parent has died, is unwell, has gone to prison, is experiencing problems with drugs and alcohol, or are neglectful or abusive.

In Shropshire, there are around 700 Kinship Carers, and there is a friendly and supportive **Shropshire Kinship Care support group** that meets regularly – face-to-face and on-line. The group is a place where Kinship Carers can meet, share, support each other and get practical advice on all aspects of being a Kinship Carer and also access to information and support through the Kinship national charity

Being a Kinship Carer is a wonderful "gift" and hugely positive "lifeline" to a child. But it is challenging and demanding. But with Shropshire Kinship Care group, you aren't alone. What age can my child be left home alone?

We often get asked what age children can be left home alone? With the holidays coming up you may be wondering whether you can leave them for a few minutes while you nip to the shop or a couple of hours while you work.

There's no legal age a child can be left home alone, but it's against the law to leave a child alone if it puts them at risk. Every child matures differently, so it would be almost impossible to have a "one size fits all" law. The NSPCC have some really helpful resources covering this which include:

Youth Vaping

Vaping is not recommended for young people because it's not risk-free and they are not completely harmless, yet so many of our young people are vaping. In response to growing concern around vaping among children and young people, a youth vaping Resource Toolkit has been developed for use by those caring for and working with children and young people.

The Toolkit includes helpful resources to support parents, carers and those working with children and young people to have conversations and deliver education around youth vaping. They're also designed to increase awareness of the risks of vaping for children and young people and help them to make informed decisions.
