One of the local farmers told me yesterday that they are concerned about the lack of landlines once fibre broadband is fully rolled out. The phone box in the village may be the only way people can call emergency services in a crisis if the fibre network goes down. It is imperative that it stays. It is opposite the primary school and a reassurance to residents many of whom are elderly (Greenacres) 2- I rarely have a mobile signal at home and all too often my broadband drops out. When our land line moves over to digital the public phone box in the village will be vital for emergency use. Therefore I object to it being removed. Councillors are aware of instances of domestic abuse and coercive control in the village and the view of the Council is that if the payphone is used by 1 person in need in a year that it's worth retaining the phone.
