Upcoming Highway Improvements – Pontesbury

Dear Customer,

We are writing to inform you of two highway improvement schemes in Pontesbury this summer to improve pedestrian facilities, enhance road safety for residents, businesses and visitors, and improve highway drainage

Where is the work?

Scheme 1 – **Hall Bank, Pontesbury**: A road closure will be required on Hall Bank to enable the Footway Improvement Works.

Scheme 2 – **Brookside, Pontesbury**: A road closure will be required at Brookside to allow the Installation of a Raised Table, Footway and Drainage Improvements.

Scheme 1 – Hall Bank, Pontesbury

When is this happening?

The works are scheduled from **Monday 24th August to Friday 4th September**, between **9:30am and 4:00pm each weekday**.

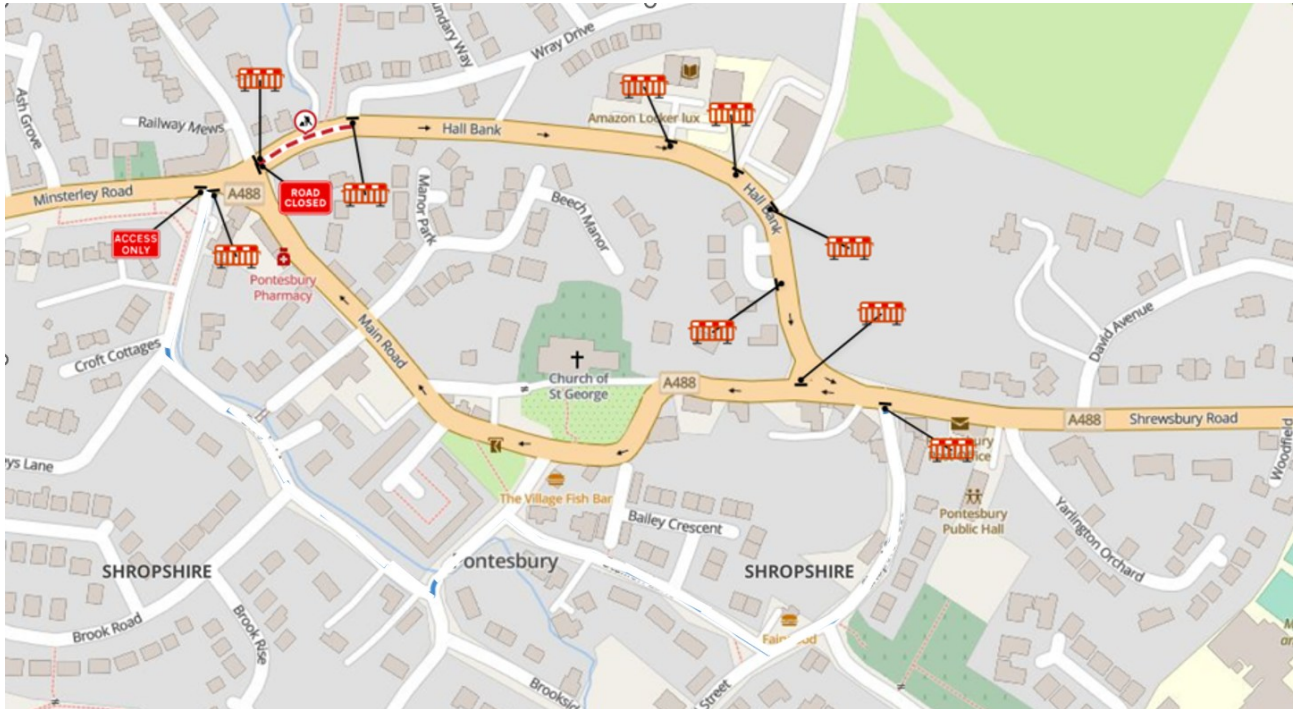
Please be aware that these dates may change due to weather or unforeseen circumstances. Any updates will be shown on local advance warning signs and on <https://one.network/>

How will this affect traffic?

A signed diversion route will be in place for the duration of the closure.

To minimise disruption and maintain public transport links to the area, a temporary **Access Only** one-way system will be introduced through Brookside, Stallion Lane and Chapel Street for the duration of the works. The purpose of this is to provide **access for residents around Brookside and for maintaining bus services**.

Temporary parking restrictions will also be in place within the affected area to aid the safe movement of vehicles.



Will there be access to my property/business?

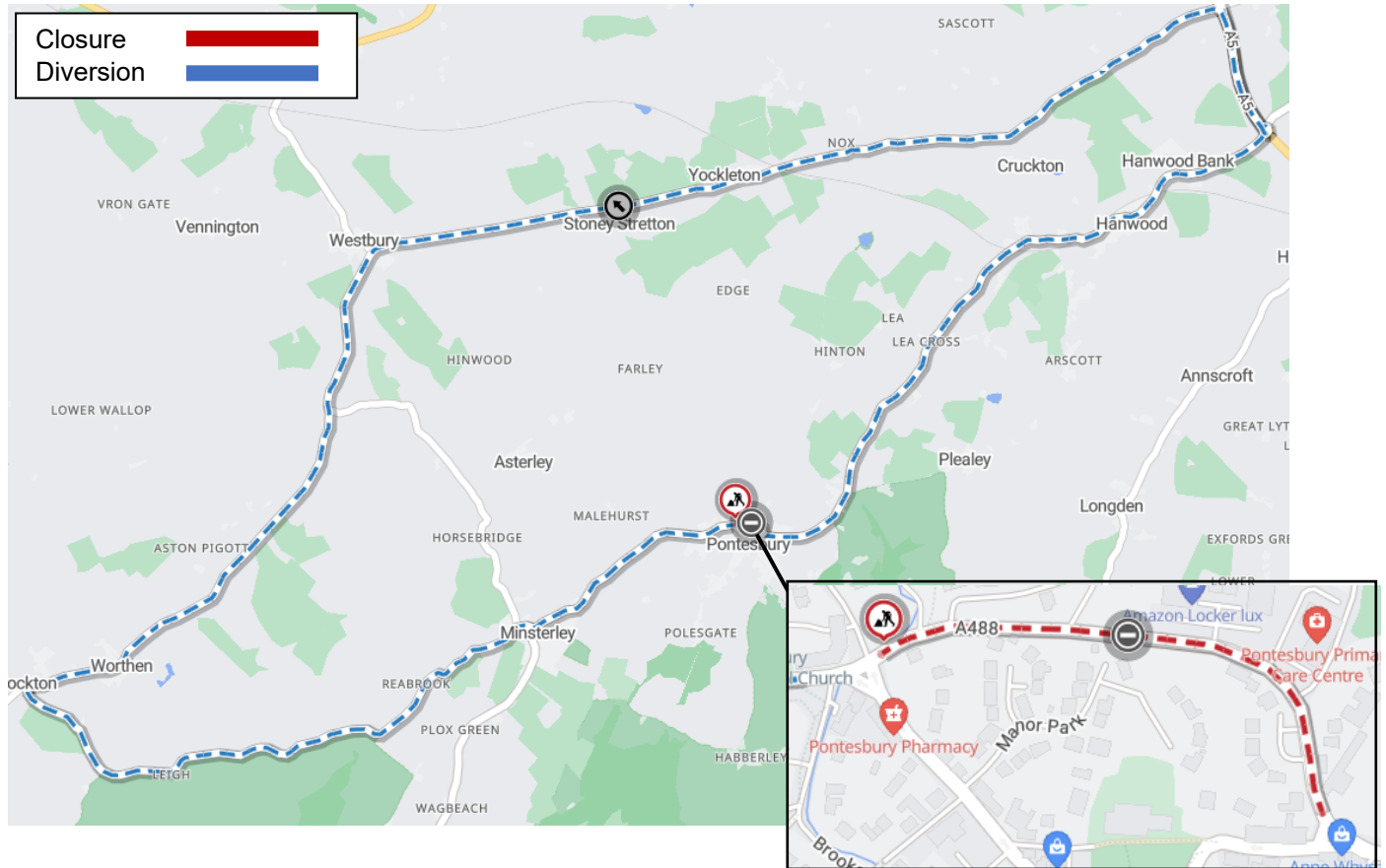
For properties and businesses affected by the **Hall Bank** closure, access will be maintained via traffic management operative controls from the top of Hall Bank, including Wray Drive, Co-Op Jct, Medical Practice, Hinton Lane and Manor Gardens. Vehicles will be directed through the closure by travelling against the usual one-way traffic system when it is safe to do so. Please follow all instructions provided by the operative and allow extra time for your journey, as short delays may occur while works are in progress.

Our on-site team will assist where possible. Our priority is to keep you and our staff safe however there may be delays or times when vehicle access cannot safely be provided.

During the work, access to the works area will be restricted to:

- Residents who live and reside within the road closure.
- Businesses located within the closure (if applicable)
- Emergency vehicles (blue light calls)

Scheme 2 - Brookside, Pontesbury

When is this happening?

The works are scheduled from **Monday 7th September to Friday 18th September under a 24hr Closure.**

How will this affect traffic?

A signed diversion route will be in place for the duration of the closure.

Will there be access to my property/business?

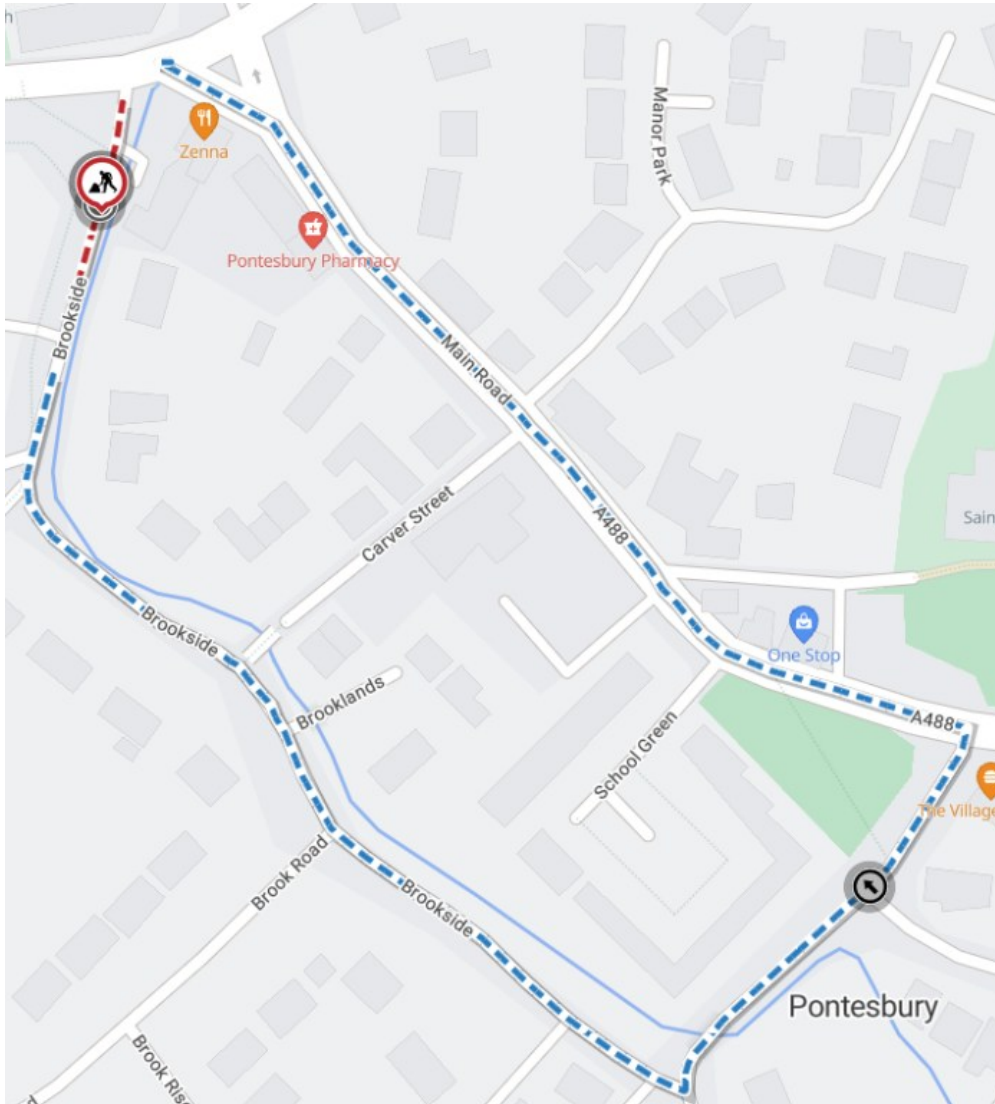
If you are looking to gain access to a property or business within the closure, we will provide access, however **vehicle access may be restricted** during working hours.

Our on-site team will assist where possible. Our priority is to keep you and our staff safe however there may be delays or times when vehicle access cannot safely be provided.

During the work, access to the works area will be restricted to:

- Residents who live and reside within the road closure.
- Businesses located within the closure (if applicable)
- Emergency vehicles (blue light calls)
