Who we are?

How do we collect information from you?

We collect information from you when you visit the Shropshire Council website also when you contact us in writing, speak to us on the phone, by email or any other type of electronic communication, or talk to us face to face.

What types of information do we collect from you?

We collect different categories of information about you, depending on the service you want from us and/or the reason why we need to process information relating to you. This could be personal information (for example your name and address), or other more sensitive data that we would only collect and use in very particular circumstances that are set out in law.

Details of information obtained from third parties?

We obtain data from the data subject, their employer or colleague, employees at council sites or other council teams.

The information that we collect about you is:

- Information about you, this could include your name, address and date of birth
- Your employee number as an identifier for you
- Employment details.
- Personal and work contact details
- Risk Assessments
- Training Records
- · Accident and incident data

How is your information used?

We may use your information to:

- in order to identify and contact you
- to determine retention period for training or accident data
- in order to assess the risk of your environment or wellbeing
- in order to maintain records and report on training delegates
- to document, record and report accidents and incidents to Shropshire Council employees or Shropshire Council sites or those with a service level agreement or contract with Shropshire Council

Research and statistics

Anonymised and pseudonymised data may be used for research & statistical purposes. Any data collected may be used for research and statistical purposes that are relevant and compatible with the purpose that the data was collected for.

Who has access to your information?

Your information is private and will only be shared when it is necessary and lawful to do so.

We may share your information with the following third parties for the reasons detailed;

- Solicitors/Barristers and other investigators due to claims and investigations
- Internally HR Advice, Risk Management & Insurance, Occupational Health
- Statutory agencies, such as the Police, Health & Safety Executive (HSE) –
 We may share your information with statutory agencies in line with our legal obligations and/or in completion of our public tasks.
- We share your email addresses and names with our DSE training and risk assessment software provider to enable them to send email links out to complete the training and risk assessment.

We will not sell or rent your information to third parties. We will not share your information with third parties for marketing purposes.

What are your rights in relation the personal data we process?

Access – you can request copies of any of your personal information that is held by the Council.

Rectification – you can ask us to correct any incorrect information.

Deletion – you can ask us to delete your personal information. The Council can refuse to delete information if we have a lawful reason to keep this.

Portability – you can ask us to transfer your personal data to different services or to you in some circumstances.

Right to object or restrict processing – you have the right to object to how your data is being used and how it is going to be used in the future.

Right to prevent automatic decisions – you have the right to challenge a decision that affects you that has been made automatically without human intervention, for example an online form with an instant decision.

How long will we keep your information for?

We keep and dispose of all records in line with our corporate retention schedule. We will comply with Data Protection legislation in regards to how long we keep your data.

What security precautions in place to protect the loss, misuse or alteration of your information?

We are strongly committed to data security and will take reasonable and appropriate steps to protect your personal information from unauthorised access, loss, misuse,

alteration or corruption. We have put in place physical, electronic, and managerial procedures to safeguard the information you provide to us. However, we cannot guarantee the security of any information you transmit to us. We recommend that you take every precaution to protect your personal information.

Keeping your data up to date

We want to ensure any information we hold is accurate. You can help us by promptly informing us of any changes to the information we hold about you.
